RE: Superintendent's Report

Please accept the following report to the Barre City School Board:

(1) Negotiations

- Teacher Negotiations:
 1. Retroactive salary adjustments from the negotiated agreement will be issued with this week's March 1 payroll.
 2. BCEMS and BTMES teaching staff begin their 7.5 hour workday when they return from vacation on March 7.
- We are setting up dates to begin negotiations for both the Para-Educator Master Agreement and the AFSCME Master Agreement, which both expire this coming June 30.

(2) Act 46

- The organizational meeting for the new Merger Study Committee is scheduled for Wednesday, February 28 at 6:00pm in the Spaulding High School Library.

(3) School Safety

- We took advantage of the availability of custodial and maintenance staff during the week of February 26 to provide the same ALICE training as administrators received last month. This has been very well received.
- We continue to work on our ALICE implementation and communication plans. Parent/community forums are being scheduled. Our tentative plan is to train year round office staff in June, instructional staff in August, and students early in the school year. We are exploring the curriculum options to use with our students.
- The recent school violence and threats of violence across the nation and in Vermont have weighed heavily on all of us. The administrative met before vacation and meets again after vacation to discuss ways to improve our safety, security, and communication. We have already implemented some changes, with more to come. We have received guidance from the state and have also heard from members of our community. We expect to hear more and will be diligent in continuing our work.
- We have also heard from many regarding the planned student walk-out protests to school shootings in the upcoming months, and are working on a plan to support the right for students to express opinions while at the same time respecting all perspectives, and most importantly keeping everyone in our school community safe.

(4) Administrator Evaluations

- Administrator evaluation review meetings have been completed or will be very soon, and evaluation write-ups will be completed by early March; contracts will be issued on April 1.
