

AACS Summer Programs activities are located on two of our school properties in Anne Arundel County. Our Middle School (MS) is located at 716 Bestgate Road, Annapolis, MD 21401. Our Upper School (US) is located at 109 Burns Crossing Road, Severn, MD 21144.

OUR FAITH

Many of our camps will incorporate Christianity into the daily schedule through prayer and teachings in an open and sensitive manner. At no point do we want your child to feel uncomfortable or forced to believe what we discuss.

Eagles Explorations has a scheduled time to share about our faith through the teaching of weekly character traits, the Fruits of the Spirit, as listed on the Summer Programs Schedule on pages 4-5. This will be a leader driven time with games, songs, stories, Biblical teachings, and open discussion. This is a time of fun and fellowship where we want to share about our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, and teach valuable life lessons.

When asked the greatest commandment in Matthew 22:37-40,

"Jesus replied, 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments" (New International Version).

In 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18, the Apostle Paul wrote to the church in Thessalonica saying, *"Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus"* (New International Version).

These passages will be at the core of our teaching.

A non-refundable \$100 deposit, per camper per session, which is credited towards tuition, is due with registration. Full payment is due before your child is permitted to attend camp.

WITHDRAWAL POLICY

All deposits are non-refundable. Further payments may be refunded on a case-by-case basis. However, we do not make exceptions in payment adjustments for the following:

- early dismissal and late arrival;
- voluntary withdrawal from a camp due to non-medical reasons;
- And/or day(s) missed due to periodic/intermittent vacation or illnesses.



SUMMER PROGRAMS OPTIONS

LUNCH INCLUDED FOR FULL DAY CAMPS!

TRANSPORTATION

Optional bus transportation is offered for all of our full day camps at the Upper School. The bus will depart from the Middle School on Bestgate Road at 8:00 am. and return at 4:45 pm. Drop-off is from 7:30 am. – 7:55 am. and pick-up is from 4:45 pm. – 5:00 pm. The fee for the bus is \$60 per child per week.

EXTENDED DAY CARE

For all camps held during the day at the Upper School, Extended Day options are available. The Extended Day program will engage campers in a variety of free play activities including games, puzzles, arts and crafts, sports, books and individual quiet time. EAGLES EXPLORATIONS

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Eagle Explorations is a summer long full day program designed to be a well-rounded and exciting experience. Each week's session begins a different theme (see page 7). That means your child can attend all seven sessions and always be challenged in a new and fun way! Blending learning and play, these programs offer a structured balance of activities to bring out your child's creativity, intellect, and athleticism as they enjoy making new friendships!

Activities are taught by experienced teaching professionals and other qualified counselors with expertise in working with children. Counselors will guide, teach, nurture and encourage campers in developing new interests, improving self-esteem, and in creating a greater respect for others. Whatever exciting activity is happening, campers will meet the challenge with confidence and enthusiasm.

Eagles Explorations is a state certified day camp and must comply with regulations of the Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene. Information on these regulations can be obtained by calling 410.266.8422.

EAGLES EXPLORATIONS SESSIONS ARE \$300 FOR THE WEEK.
As there is no camp on Thursday, July 4 and Friday July 5th; the 3-day week is only \$240.

THE FOLLOWING DISCOUNTS ONLY APPLY TO EAGLES EXPLORATIONS
The week of July 1 Early Bird, Sibling, and AACCS Student Discounts are only \$20.

EARLY BIRD DISCOUNT
Register by March 31, 2019 and receive a \$25 early bird discount for each child per week of camp (\$100 non-refundable deposit, per camper per session, is due with registration). The early bird discount will not be transferred from one week to another if the transfer is made after March 31, 2019.

SIBLING DISCOUNT
For every session that you register more than one child in Eagles Explorations, you will receive \$25 off the second, third, and each additional child. The sibling discount will be applied by the Summer Programs office after you register.

AACCS STUDENT DISCOUNT
All students enrolled at AACCS for the '19-'20 school year will receive a \$25 discount per week. Contact the Summer Programs office for details on how to obtain the discount.

PRORATING
Contact the Summer Programs office if you would only like your child to only attend a portion of the camp week. Half day tuition, 9:00am – 12:00pm or 1:00pm – 4:00pm, is \$165 for the week. Daily rate is \$80 per day. These rates will only be applied if arrangements have made prior to the start of camp.

SWIMMING
Once a week, the Eagles Explorations group travels to the Severna Park Community Center to swim in the pool. Since the facilities are indoor it's always fun—rain or shine.

NOTE: Children in the Discoverers age group will remain at AACCS to participate in a water day program on campus.

FRIDAY CELEBRATIONS

To wrap up camp every Friday, we welcome all family and friends to experience what the campers have been talking about all week. Slide shows, video productions and award programs are presented at 3:00 pm in the Kerr Center for the Arts auditorium. ABOUT YOUR EAGLES EXPLORATIONS GROUPS

Your child will automatically be placed into one of the following groups based on age. Throughout the day, the groups will stay together as they enjoy all the fun and excitement offered at their level.

- Discoverers (ages 3 ½ to 5)
- Flyers (ages 6 to 7)
- Voyagers (ages 8 to 9)
- Pioneers (ages 10 to 11)
- Trailblazers (ages 12 to 13)

Must be a rising freshman in order to apply for a chance to be selected for the program
CIT (ages 14 to 16)

DISCOVERERS

Discoverers are guided in a safe and nurturing environment while participating in a mix of fun and exciting activities. This group is a structured program designed to give young campers a taste of what our older camper's experience. Activities include story time, playground fun, physical education, arts and crafts, science, wrestling room, water games, toy time, Bible, theme, and video.

FLYERS

Flyers are challenged each day with a balanced mix of active learning and play under the leadership of an experienced team of teachers and counselors. Activities include story time, playground fun, physical education, wrestling room, science, arts and crafts, drama and improv, Bible, video, theme, nature walks, and water games.

VOYAGERS

Voyagers are the “on the move” campers. Campers will be engaged in various activities throughout the day under the leadership of enthusiastic counselors. Activities include physical education, wrestling room, science, arts and crafts, drama and improv, Bible, video production, photography, theme, nature walks and water games.

PIONEERS AND TRAILBLAZERS

Campers will be engaged in various activities throughout the day under the leadership of enthusiastic counselors. These groups are “on the move” including all the activities of the Voyagers as well as being challenged with Adobe Photoshop and archery.

COUNSELORS-IN-TRAINING (CIT)

The CIT program is designed for teens interested in working with children and developing leadership skills, while gaining work-oriented experience. This program provides a CIT the opportunity to train under experienced staff while assisting in the day-to-day operations of the camp. CIT's will meet daily with the CIT coordinator for planning, team-building exercises, and leadership training sessions. Time will also be spent observing and assisting counselors as they lead campers, and as the program develops, leading campers with their own games. CIT's will sign up by the week, for \$150, which includes lunch each day and Wednesday field trip costs.

Note: CIT's who have already completed 6 weeks with a minimum score of 360 out of 450 on their evaluation report from the CIT Coordinator should contact the Summer Programs Office for information on how to be grandfathered into the previous cost structure.

EAGLES EXPLORATIONS ACTIVITY DESCRIPTIONS

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Campers will learn and play one sport per week as they are engulfed in the joys of athletics and competition while gaining the benefits of physical activity. Basketball week 1, team handball week 2, soccer week 3, team handball week 4, basketball week 5, and baseball/kickball week 6.

ARTS AND CRAFTS

Each week will focus on new projects, many of which will relate to the theme of the week, including painting and drawing, sculpting with paper mache, jewelry/accessory making, art around the world, and other projects to bring out a camper's inner creativity.

SCIENCE

Each week campers will conduct fun experiments and hands-on projects as they explore science in a variety of ways.

DRAMA AND IMPROV

Whose Line Is It Anyway meets Eagles Explorations in this fun time of creativity and laughter as campers play a variety of drama and improv games.

BIBLE

This class will focus on our weekly character traits, the Fruit of the Spirit, as listed on the Summer Programs Schedule on pages 4-5. This will be a leader driven time with games, songs, stories, Biblical teachings, and open discussion. This is a time of fun and fellowship where we want to share about our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, and teach valuable life lessons. At no point do we want your child to feel uncomfortable or forced to believe what we discuss.

CHAPEL

Once a week, campers will gather together for chapel, where a speaker will share a Fruit of the Spirit character based message and how applying these principles to your life will help build a stronger community. During this time, campers will also break up into mini groups and go through a series of discussion questions designed to strengthen relationships as each child is given a chance to speak in a loving environment.

THEME

Dedicated to the theme of the week, campers will prepare for the Friday field day through games, projects, and activities!

TEAM BUILDING

NEW for this year, campers will engage in various types of challenges and activities that will be used to enhance social relations and define roles within a team. Groups will problem solve, play group games against themselves and other groups within the camp. Counselors will supervise and maintain positive interaction amongst peers when competing so that campers will understand how to have the right attitude whether you win or lose a game.

PHOTOGRAPHY

Campers will take pictures and learn about aspects specific to photography such as lighting and angles. Photographs from this group are always presented to the entire camp at the end-of-the-week slideshow.

VIDEO PRODUCTION

Campers will develop, choreograph and produce a music video, camp newscast, or another creative production. From start to finish, campers will star in these mini productions which are shown at the end-of week celebration.

WATER GAMES

Each week campers will participate in games, races and relays involving water to cool down in the summer heat. Sprinklers, slip and slide, water balloons and other creative activities are all part of the fun.

PHOTOSHOP

Pioneers and Trailblazers will have time in the computer lab learning about Adobe Photoshop as they work with their own photos and images to design individual masterpieces.

ARCHERY/OUTDOOR ADVENTURE

Pioneers and Trailblazers will learn the basics of archery and will participate in fun challenges and end-of-the-week tournaments. **NEW** this year for all age groups, campers will be able to; explore, challenge themselves and learn fun outdoor games and challenging activities like orienteering which will teach the campers how to navigate a course while using a compass or going nature walks to find hidden treasure! Parents will be notified in advance of this unique opportunity so that campers can come prepared with an old pair of sneakers or water shoes..


