



Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to once again provide you with information about the Mooresville Graded School District through the North Carolina School Report Card. This annual report card contains data, statistics and other important measures regarding student performance, class size, attendance, school safety, instructional resources and teacher quality, both for the district as well as for each school.

In 2017 - 2018, Mooresville Graded School District once again excelled in academic achievement. As a district, the Mooresville Graded School District grade-level proficiency was at 70.3 percent, which was eighth in the state of North Carolina among all 115 school districts. This percentage is 11.5 points higher than the state average of 58.8 percent. When analyzing the data, the district was pleased with specific results at all levels. There are 25 different categories of End-of-Course / End-of-Grade tests required by the state administered to students in grades three through twelve. Out of these 115 districts, MGSD ranked as a top 10 district in over 50 percent of the categories tested. In 21 of the categories, MGSD ranked as a top 20 district. MGSD third grade students indicate a bright future with an overall ranking of third in the state and a 2nd-place ranking in Math. Our secondary students also did well finishing ninth in North Carolina in combined scores for tests at the high school level. These results are evidence that MGSD is pushing students to excel at all levels.

While the North Carolina Report Card offers much information about our schools, there is much more to know about the unique strategies and plans our district has underway to provide the best educational opportunities for every student. We remain committed to excellence – for our schools, our students, and our staff. Please join us in our efforts to create the very best school system in North Carolina.
