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Crops by Kids News



A HUGE thank you to all who helped make the Farmer's Market a big success. Again this fall we hosted the CBK Farmer's Market on September 27th, the night of the PreK-4 Open House. It was great to see students and adults in the gym viewing the Farmer's Market produce and enjoying the other informational tables. All proceeds from the market and supper go to support the Barre Town Crops by Kids garden. Local farmers, staff and Barre Town families donated crops for parents, faculty and community members to purchase. We sincerely appreciate the donations and are grateful for

the ongoing support. We hope you had a chance to see or purchase some of the crops. This is truly a community event!

The final count on what we raised from the Farmer's Market, combined with the Harvest Dinner, isn't available yet. This information will be in the November newsletter. The Harvest supper was a great success serving a delicious dinner of ziti, salad, bread and desert. Thanks to the kitchen staff for putting this together. Our raffle this year included painted, plastic pumpkins and a quilt, among other items. Congratulations to the winners.

As always a BIG thanks to Susan Barnard for organizing this event. Other thank yous go out to Suzy Kleinfelter, Tina Glosser, Bridgett Apfel, Deb Gibson, all of the folks who painted pumpkins, and students and staff who helped out in various ways. The kiwi are beginning to mature. At the Farmer's Market several people had the chance to taste them for the first time and were pleasantly surprised at the flavor. The kiwis are the vines growing over the tables near the back of the garden. We will prune them back in the spring - they have grown over the past 6 years and are getting heavy.

There was a fabulous response to the Fall Garden Club. Twelve second grade students were selected to participate this fall. Garden Club continues to enjoy the enthusiasm from the students. During the first session, we looked at the seeds that each of the flowers or crops had produced. The scarlet runner beans were a big hit. This summer the flowers are bright scarlet, encouraging bees and other pollinators to visit. Scarlet runner beans are good for snap, shell or dry beans. The colors of the large seeds range from pink to red to dark purple mottled in black and some had those colors mixed.

The students in the Garden Club will help put the garden to bed in the next couple of weeks, depending on the first frost. Mrs. Thygesen's gym classes will also help put the garden to bed.

Thanks to Phyllis Wiggins for keeping the fountain clean this summer and fall!

If you have visited the garden this fall, you may have noticed 3 tall wooden "creatures" positioned around the garden. They were donated this summer from one of the families attending the summer garden/library series.

Fall is here! And with the cooler air, we are all enjoying crisp apples, cider, and a bounty of harvest vegetables. The excitement builds as we look to the fall activities that so many enjoy, with one of the most popular being Halloween. With that time just around the corner, here are a few safety tips to keep in mind:

Walk Safely:

Cross the street at the corner, looking both ways and making eye contact with drivers of vehicles.

Put electronic devices down and keep your head up!

Always walk on sidewalks and paths. If you must walk where there are no sidewalks, walk facing traffic as far to the left as possible.

Walk in groups, and always have an adult accompany your children.

Carry a flashlight or a glow stick.

Watch for cars that are turning, or backing up. Remind your children not to cross between parked cars or dart out into the street.

Dress Safely:

Plan costumes that are bright and reflective! Consider adding reflective tape to the costumes.

Pay attention to the length of the costumes – keep them short enough to prevent tripping.

Ideally, use costumes that are flame resistant.

Confirm that masks are not limiting or blocking eyesight.

Avoid decorative contact lenses.

Keep accessories (like swords, sticks, canes) short to prevent injuries if your child stumbles.

Share Safely:

Remove from the porch or yard anything a child could trip over (hoses, toys, bikes, decorations).

Replace any burned-out light bulbs.

Sweep wet leaves or snow from sidewalks and steps.

Restrain pets so that they do not bite or jump on a visitor.

Drive Safely:

Slow down and be especially alert – children will be excited and unpredictable.

Enter and exit driveways and alleys slowly and carefully.

Eliminate any distractions inside your car to enable you to concentrate on the roads and surroundings.

Turn your headlights on earlier in the day.

Remember that popular trick-or-treating hours are 5:30 p.m. – 9:30 p.m.

Student Arrival and Dismissal Information

Arrival Information

- Middle school students in grades 5-8 may not be dropped off at school before 7:30 am
- Elementary school students in grades PreK-4 may not be dropped off at school before 8:30 am
- Students who are dropped off earlier than the stated times must be registered with the YMCA's
 Before School program. There is a fee associated with this program. This program is available to
 students K-8.
- If a student is dropped off before stated times and is not registered with the YMCA, families will be called to come pick the student back up.

Dismissal Information

- Middle school dismissal is at 2:30 pm.
- Middle school students may not wait to be picked up after 2:30 pm anywhere in the building (including the lobby, cafeteria, or library) unless they are signed up for a supervised activity (such as homework club).
- Middle school students who are not riding a bus must be signed out in the lobby by the adult picking them up, students may not meet a ride in the parking lot.
- Elementary school dismissal is at 3:30 pm.
- Parent pick up for elementary school students is at 3:25 pm in the cafeteria. The sign out sheets for parent pick up are located in the cafeteria.

When to Keep your Child Home from School:

Children who are ill should stay home for at least 24 hours after they no longer have a fever, or signs of a fever, without the use of fever-reducing medicines.

Children ill with vomiting should stay home for 24 hours after the vomiting has stopped. This is to not only prevent

the spread of their illness, but also to protect them from contracting other illness at school.


