Parking Lot Update: Progress has been temporarily paused while the plan is being revised and approved.

SPIRE Update: 23 of 79 students are at or above benchmark. These students have made a lot of progress and we are proud of them! SPIRE is working! We are serving less students this year, first because we didn't have as many to serve, and second, students get 45 minutes in a group of 3 instead of 25 minutes in a group of 4. We are serving 9-12 students per grade level, with the exception of 6th grade. The 6th grade students who need that level of reading tutoring are in resource.

Review of 2017-2018 School Report Card: We were very close to state average in our ELA, Math, and Science achievement. We are showing typical growth in ELA, and Science, and high growth in Math. Our goal is to work on our English Language Learners. 31% made adequate progress, however we would like to see them making proficiency. Our attendance is not as high as we would like it to be, but it has improved.
