Crops by Kids



As I write this, snow blankets the ground. Snow is an important insulator, especially for perennials. Let's hope it stays.

Maybe some of you have seed catalogues already on your counter. It isn't too early to think of all the plants you want to grow this summer. We hope many of you are anticipating the Annual Crops by Kids Seed Fundraiser. We will, once again, be offering regular and

organic seeds from the FEDCO Seed Company. Your seed orders support necessary purchases for our school/community garden.

Be looking for the seed order forms by mid-January. If you don't receive one, and would like to, email dcurtis@u61.net with your child's name and homeroom teacher. We want to support your gardening needs, and we'd like you to support ours.

This year we encourage you to invite your family, friends and neighbors to buy seeds with us. The last couple of years we had record sales! The more seeds sold, the greater percentage we get. Ask family and friends to participate and feel free to make copies of the seed order forms that come home or ask your child's teacher for more.

We are looking to hire someone to prune the kiwis. Much of the proceeds from the seed sale will help fund this need. You may notice the lime green tags blowing around the kiwi vines. The tags will help to identify which branches produced kiwis this summer. This information will be important when they are pruned, as they need to be pruned *before* they produce fruit again.

So here's to a winter with the hope of plenty of snow to cover the garden and for plain 'ol fun in the snow.

How to Force Paper Whites (a great project to do with young children)

Paper whites are the original "Just Add Water" plant. The <u>fragrant flowers</u> bloom within about 3 weeks of planting, for almost instant gratification. While paperwhite bulbs can be planted in soil, more commonly they are grown in pots or dishes with some stones or marbles to anchor them in place and a little water.



Select a container that is about 3 - 4 inches deep that has no drainage holes. You won't be adding soil and you do not want a container so deep that the bulbs will be completely submerged.

Spread an inch or 2 of stones, marbles or even gravel, along the bottom of the container. Whatever material you choose, it should be clean. Position your paper white bulbs, <u>pointed end up</u>, on top of the stone layer. Go ahead and squeeze them in tightly. They not only look better in a large group, the tight fit will help keep them from toppling over. Add another layer of stones to fill in any gaps and cover the bulbs up to their shoulders. The pointed tips should still be showing. Do not bury the bulbs completely.

Add water so that the level just reaches the base of the bulbs. Allowing the bottom of the bulb to sit in water will stimulate growth. Covering the entire bulb with water could cause it to rot.

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Crops by Kids - Forcing Paper whites (con't)

The bulbs don't need light at this point and they prefer to be kept on the cool side, at about 65 degrees. Unlike other bulbs that are forced, you do not need to put your paper whites into darkness. It is probably better if they are left out in the open, so you will remember to check the water level. Check your bulbs daily to see if they need more water. You want the level to remain just touching the base of the bulbs. They will slowly uptake some of the water and you will lose some to evaporation, but you shouldn't need to add large amounts of water.

When you see roots developing, it is time to move the container to a sunny window. The sunnier the better, but try not to let them get too warm or they'll grow leggy. Most windows are a little cool in winter, so don't be afraid to get them close to the windowpane.

Once the plants flower, they will last longer if moved out of direct sunlight, to a cool spot with indirect or diffused light. If you keep your house warm, your paper whites will last longer if you move them to a cooler room when you are not home, and then move them back to your living area, to enjoy when you are home.

The Annual Semi-formal School Dance is always an exciting time. Please keep in mind that the school dress code applies to this event. Specifically:


- dresses must be of appropriate length
