Crops by Kids News



This had been crazy weather for growing crops. The rain in the spring and early summer dampened (bad pun) the growing season. The garden didn't get many types of squash this year. Now we are experiencing hot weather and crops like spinach and lettuce bolt and stop growing.

The kiwi, yes we are growing kiwi, is beginning to mature. It takes approximately 5 years from planting until harvest. Right now there are a limited number of kiwis ready to eat and

students have sampled them. For many this is the first time they have eaten kiwis. The kiwis are the vines growing over the tables near the back of the garden.

The Crops by Kids School/Community garden has continued to be busy as the school year gets under way. Students, along with faculty and staff, have enjoyed the garden in various ways.

We had a fabulous response to the fall 2017 <u>Fall Garden Club.</u> Ten second grade students were selected to participate this fall. Garden Club continues to enjoy the enthusiasm from the students. There will be a spring session of the garden club, so if your student was not selected this time, perhaps they may participate in the spring.

The students in the Garden Club will help put the garden to bed in the next couple of weeks, depending on the first frost. Mrs. Thygesen's gym classes will also help put the garden to bed.

Again this fall, we hosted the CBK **Farmer's Market** on September 28th, the night of the PreK-4 Open House. It was great to see students and adults in the gym viewing the Farmer's Market produce and enjoying the other informational tables. All proceeds from the market and supper go to support the Barre Town Crops by Kids garden. Local farmers, staff and Barre Town families donated crops for parents, faculty and community members to purchase. We sincerely appreciate the donations and are grateful for the ongoing support. The final count on what we raised from the Farmer's Market, combined with the Harvest Dinner, is complete. We raised \$1700.00 with your help! 
*Read Together for Fun! In addition to having your child read out loud to you, model reading in front of him. Allow him to "catch you" reading!

When to Keep your Child Home from School:

Children who are ill should stay home for at least 24 hours after they no longer have a fever, or signs of a fever, without the use of fever-reducing medicines.

Children ill with vomiting should stay home for 24 hours after the vomiting has stopped. This is to not only prevent



the spread of their illness, but also to protect them from contracting other illness at school.


