This fall several second graders participated in the Garden Club. We sampled the kiwi growing in the garden, picked vegetables to eat right then or to take home and also cleaned up the garden.

If you grow house plants, you may be interested in a new book by Will Creed, Don't Repot That House Plant !: And Other Indoor Plant Care Mistakes. Will suggests that house plants do not need to be repotted unless the soil is so old that you have to water the plant 3 - 4 times a week. He has plants that have been in the same pot for over 5 years. According to Will, "repotting is rarely necessary. A plant may seem root bound but it loves its pot just the size it is. If it is healthy, it is thriving. Contrary to conventional wisdom, repotting a plant isn't always the answer". Another suggestion is that if you do need to re pot a plant, use a pot just one size bigger. A larger pot will inhibit growth.

World Kindness Day is November 13, 2017!

The "Random Acts of Kindness" movement is gaining momentum!

A few years ago, the local and national news highlighted how those of us here in Barre, Vermont, understand this concept. Following a 12-hour shift at the hospital, a local nurse stopped in to the *L & M Diner* on Main Street for breakfast. She no-

ticed a father and son sharing a meal together, and she chose to pay for their food. They, in turn, paid for someone else, who paid for someone after them . . . and before the diner closed at 3 pm, the good deeds continued - with a total of 46 guests who "paid it forward"! What a fantastic experience!

As we approach "World Kindness Day," let's take note of some of the benefits of being kind: "kindness makes us happier, gives us healthier hearts, slows aging, makes for better relationships, and is contagious!" (Published by Good News Network, February 11, 2015.) Wow! That is quite the incentive! How can we encourage kindness with our children? Dr. Claire Nicogossian, a psychologist writing for the <u>Today Parenting Team</u>, published some suggestions on November 3, 2015:

Be a Role Model – treat yourself, your children, family, friends, and strangers kindly.

Community Service – assist those in your community with their various needs.

Talk about Kindness – ask your children how they feel about how others treat them.

Use Teachable Moments – use the opportunities that naturally take place to talk, process, and teach your child.

Our children are constantly influenced by the culture that surrounds them. Let's use the daily events to encourage them to accept the strength that comes from kindness. And enjoy finding ways to show random acts of kindness.

Brain Development and Child Health Study

BE PART OF THE LARGEST STUDY OF BRAIN DEVELOPMENT AND CHILD HEALTH!



WHAT IS THE ABCD STUDY?

ABCD stands for Adolescent Brain Cognitive Development, and it is a landmark study supported by the National Institutes of Health (NIH). Across the country ABCD investigators will enroll 10,000 families and follow children from ages 9 – 10 into early adulthood. The goal is to understand how children's experiences affect brain development and other aspects of their life - including school, friendships, behavior and health.

WHY SHOULD VERMONT KIDS PARTICIPATE?

The University of Vermont is one of only 21 sites selected to run the ABCD study. This is a great opportunity to ensure that Vermont youth and their experiences are included in this nationwide study. All data will be treated confidentially and kids and their parents will be reimbursed for their participation.

HOW CAN MY FAMILY PARTICIPATE?

If you are the parent or legal guardian of a 9 or 10 year old your family may be eligible to participate. Look for printed material to come home from school with your child soon. We look forward to meeting your family!


