- 1. Minutes reviewed and approved unanimously
- 2. Trustland budget update
 - a. 1st term around 25% of budget per goal utilized.
 - i. Math at 13% of budget, went ahead and hired 2 additional math tutors.
 - b. Budget allows to keep aids/tutors until final week of school rather than when DIBELS is completed.
- 3. Determined there is no concern for Goal #2 measurement tools. Most teachers are utilizing the pre and post tests in GoMath. Will discuss further at faculty meetings to encourage teachers to use baseline or pretests for better quality data.
- 4. Report on training from Brittany Christianson: Ensure Principal is a contributor but does not run the meeting. Reiterated the importance of appropriate measurement tools to determine progress of SIP goals.
- 5. Moby Max plan put in place
 - a. Principal will gather input from teachers and faculty about use, will also assess teacher comfort level and ability to navigate all components of the program.

- b. Evaluate parent education and determine if students are using at home.
- c. Make a decision based on results on future of Moby Max
- 6. Risk Management has not been out yet. But a video will be made to help parents understand how pickup and dropoff works.
 - a. Council suggested having Kaysville police start the year helping to guide and potential enforce and then make a few appearances throughout the year.
 - b. Parent volunteers to help with pick up and drop off so they can learn from experience.
 - c. Discussed raised crosswalk at the top of the catwalk in Fruit Heights. (Kyle talk with city and neighbors)

NOTES

- Infinity digital learning experience discussion
 - Trial run with grades 4-6 beginning in January 2019 for one year, funds can be prorated if council decides to use LAND trust expenditures for 2019-2020 school year.
 - \$5,400 for licenses for those grades (Includes Lesson Plans.)
- Need to get more parents involved
 - Improve communication between parents and teachers.
