Why do we need technology in the classroom?

*Use GPS Research Tools instead.

- These are databases that are vetted for high quality information and paid for by the district to support your child's learning.



Which Apps are students using?

*It varies by teacher. Each teacher is deemed the best professional to make decisions about the technology being employed within their individual classroom. However, they must choose from a host of vetted tools (high quality & have signed a privacy agreement).

*Teachers may request an app. The request goes to the coordinators of each department and is then vetted and approved (or not) by the members of the curriculum council. The curriculum council is made up of Irene Parisi, some principals, program coordinators, teachers and Board of Ed liaisons.
