

The Roots of Disruptive/Unsafe Behavior: Mental Health NATIONALLY LOCALLY

- Increase in teen anxiety & depression
- Teen Suicide up 70% since 2008
 - Factors: Social Media, Academic & Personal Stress. & TRAUMA


(Fall of 18 at DHS)

Prevalence Of Nicotine Vaping



- 75% increase in use of e-cigarettes amongst high schoolers in 2018 compared to 2017 (FDA)
- 25% of teens using marijuana
- Perception of Risk:2016 17.1%2017 14.1%

Bringing counselors and psychiatrists into schools is effective: "This is considered a preferable model of care," she says. These programs are new, but data shows that school counseling for kids at risk for substance abuse leads to less absenteeism and better school performance.

Hire a full-time licensed clinical mental health counselor, OR contract those services out independently
