Minnesota's Immunization Law



Immunizations recommended but not required:

Influenza

Annually for all children age 6 months and older

	Rotavirus For infants	Human papillomavirus At age 11-12 years
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Not required after 24 months.

- If the child has already had chickenpox disease, varicella shots are not required. If the disease occurred after 2010, the child's doctor must sign a form confirming disease.
- (3) First graders who are 6 years old and younger must follow the polio and DTaP/DT schedules for kindergarten.
- ④ Fifth shot of DTaP not needed if fourth shot was after age 4. Final dose of DTaP on or after age 4.
- (5) Fourth shot of polio not needed if third shot was after age 4. Final dose of polio on or after age 4.
- 🜀 Need proof of at least three tetanus and diphtheria containing doses. If up to date on DTaP/DT series, no additional doses needed.
- ⑦ An alternate two-shot schedule of hepatitis B may also be used for kids age 11 through 15 years.
- 8 One dose of Tdap is required beginning at 7th grade. Also need proof of at least two tetanus and diphtheria containing doses (DTaP/DT/Td). If a child received Tdap prior to 7th grade, another dose of Tdap is not needed.
- (9) One dose is required beginning at 7th grade. The booster dose is usually given at 16 years.

Exemptions To enroll in child care, early childhood programs, and school in Minnesota, children must show they've had these immunizations or file a legal exemption.

Parents may file a medical exemption signed by a health care provider or a non-medical exemption signed by a parent/guardian and notarized.

During online registration you will have the opportunity to inform us of any special conditions for your child that our health services should be made aware of. Our Student Health staff will also be available at Future Winhawk Registration Night February 18, 2019.

HOW TO REGISTER

To register visit **WinonaSchools.org/kindergarten**. If your family is new to Winona Area Public Schools select "New Family"; if you have other children within the district select "Current Family". Infinite Campus is the WAPS registration site and it will walk you through the registration process.

What do I need to register online?

- Electronic copy of your child's immunization record
- Electronic verification of your child's birth
- Family phone numbers
- Addresses
- Email
- Child care providers

What if I do not have electronic copies?

No worries! Join us on February 18 for Future Winhawk Registration Night. You can bring your hard copies and we will make copies for you and attach to your account. WAPS Tech Support will also be available to support you.

EARLY CHILDHOOD SCREENING

In Minnesota, all children are required to complete Early Childhood Screening before they enter public kindergarten. Screening is a free check of your child's development (language, thinking, physical skills) height, weight, vision and hearing.

Ríos Spanish Immersion Program

The Ríos Spanish Immersion program provides educational experiences, that support academic and linguistic development in two languages and that develop students' appreciation of their own and other cultures.



Features of the Ríos Spanish Immersion

- 90% of the K-2 student's academic time will include learning subject matter in Spanish
- Students will become proficient Spanish listeners, speakers, writers, and readers
- Students will master content in the same subject areas as their counterparts who do not attend the program
- Students will participate in art, music, and physical education taught in English
- Language Arts is taught in English starting in 3rd grade

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
