Students will build an online presence with a digital portfolio.

Weekly Drawings will be due by the end of class on Friday of each week. Remember this is an honors class and your weekly drawings should reflect that.

*If you will not be here on the due date because of a school event, doctor's appointment, athletic event, etc, it is YOUR RESPONSIBILITY to make sure your work is turned in by the due date If you are absent due to illness, unexpected life circumstances, etc., this is part of life. Your work will be accepted for full credit when you return.

INCOMPLETE PROJECTS should be turned in by the due date. However, because of each student's artistic pace, students may turn in the project again for a regrade NO LATER than a week after the original due date.*No late work will be accepted the week before the end of the 9 weeks.

STUDENT EXPECTACTIONS

ATTENDANCE

- Arrive on Time and Be Prepared to Start Class
