SCHOOL-AGE CARE AND BROOKLINE FAQ

Frequently Asked Questions:

Q: What is the District doing to partner with the community for school-age care programs?

A: The district is working with current and new providers who believe they can offer a variety of program options. We've heard from the following providers whose information for 2019-20 will be posted to our website once received:

Q: Have any new providers been identified?

A: Yes. The YMCA is now offering a supplemental kindergarten program starting for the 2019-2020 school year. The flyer has been posted to our website.

Q: How does a parent or guardian learn about school-age care providers?

Q: Will the district continue to bus students to/from the current and new provider locations to the elementary schools?

A: Transportation for students shall be provided in accordance with district policy and guidelines. Area drop-off and pick-up locations will be available from the providers per the <u>District Transportation Guidelines</u>.

Q: When does the District Kindergarten registration begin?

Q: How do I register for Kindergarten in the School District of Haverford Township?

Q: What is happening with the Brookline building?

A: The School District is transferring ownership of Brookline to the Township.

Q: Why is the building being transferred to the Township?

A: The maintenance and facility needs of the building require a substantial investment of funds that are cost prohibitive to the district.

Q: When did the District decide to move in this direction?

A: The district began discussions about transferring ownership of the property about a year ago.

Q: When were the building occupants notified of the transfer?

A: When the transfer began we informed the building occupants. We recognized that it was important they continue onsite operations until the end of the school year.
