Progress toward goals

Goal 1: Each year, students in grades K-7 will on average gain at least 1.25 grade levels in Reading.

- CCLCS: Grades K-8 on average 38% of students met or exceeded national average for student growth in Reading.
(3rd grade literacy increased 18.5% on the ACT Aspire State Test)

Goal 2: Each year, students in grades K-7 will on average gain at least 1.25 grade levels in Math.

- CCLCS: Grades K-8 on average 41% of students met or exceeded national average for student growth in math.

Goal 3: Each year families will express overall satisfaction with the school based on the Lighthouse Family Survey.

- CCLCS: 85% of parents rated the schools Good or Excellent.
