From the Guidance Department:

College Night, GHS' annual college fair is being held Thursday October 11th from 7pm-9pm in the Student Center. The back parking lot will be reserved for college admissions reps. Shuttle buses will be available from the Central Middle School parking lot, and we recommend carpooling or getting dropped off. College Night is especially suited to students in 10th and 11th grade beginning research into their options. Sophomores, Juniors and Seniors with learning disabilities, ADD/ADHD, or Autism Spectrum Disorders who are considering the need for a structured support program at the college/university level are invited to attend a speaker pre-session before College Night. Held from 6pm to 7pm in Room 805 (Chorale Music Room), a panel of admissions reps from Adelphi University, Curry College, Landmark College, Marist College and Manhattanville College will speak about "Support Services in Postsecondary Education".

The PSAT is being administered to all freshmen, all sophomores, and previously registered juniors on Wednesday October 10th. For the special daily schedule, please see the GHS website. Students must bring #2 pencils and a calculator. We also recommend they bring snacks and water for during the breaks, as testing runs from 8:30-12:15. Further details will be emailed to each grade level.

Student Activities:

GHS Dress Code

We ask parents to help students make wise decisions about the clothing they wear to school. As stated in our Parent Handbook: Dress Code Students should dress within reasonable limits so that their dress does not jeopardize the health or safety of the wearers or others, or cause distraction or disruption of the educational process as determined by the administration. (Clothing which advertises drugs or alcohol is inappropriate for school wear.) GHS reserves the right to determine what constitutes dress that is disruptive to the educational climate or process. Footwear and shirts must be worn at all times. Clothing should be neat and clean. Teachers may ask students to remove their hats during class time.

Anonymous Alerts

Anonymous Alerts allows students or parents to anonymously submit any sensitive or urgent student issues quickly to school officials. Students or parents can submit reports such as bullying, cyberbullying, depression, dating violence, drug or alcohol use, threats against the school, weapons on campus and more. NEW: 2018-2019 Student Drop Off/Pick Up Procedures

Parent Drop Off - Following the same pattern as last year, parent drop off before school will be in the BACK of the school. Parents will be directed to enter GHS through the main entrance, drive behind the building and drop off students by the gym. Greenwich Police will assist us in directing traffic. For obvious safety reasons, parents should not drop students off in the street, in neighbors' driveways, or in other entrances to GHS. For your convenience, students may be dropped off at 7:15. They will be minimally supervised until security and other school personnel arrive at 8:00.

Parent Pick Up - Following the same pattern as last year, parent pick up after school will be in the BACK of the school. Parents will be directed to enter GHS through the main entrance, drive behind the building and pick up students by the gym. Greenwich Police will assist us in directing traffic.
