It is recommended that students serve in existing programs in areas of liturgical, catechetical, music, social ministry, or children's and youth ministry.

NOTE: <u>ALL hospitals are considered approved agencies</u>, the list below is not of all approved hostpitals but of those hospitals which SPX students have worked with in the past.

General responsibilities include directing visitors at the information desk, supervising the gift shop, distributing materials to patients, and making a difference in a patient's life. Be sure that contracted work includes personal interaction, and not just filing, etc. <u>Call early</u> for registration deadlines and dates of mandatory orientation sessions and training workshops. <u>Some hospital volunteer programs only give hours during the summer, so make sure you can complete your hours in the time they have program for you or you may find yourself not being able to complete your hours in the fall. Be clear about your expectations and ask good guestions.</u>
