GREETINGS FROM OUR PRESIDENT



Dear Fuqua Family,

As I enter my final year at Fuqua School, I am honored to reflect on the amazing accomplishments of our students, the exciting expansions of our program, and the tremendous generosity of our supporters. Fuqua School is such a special place, and the success of our students is a testament to the dedication and hard work of so many people!

From academics to operations, technology is an integral part of Fuqua School, helping us prepare our students for life in an interconnected, global world. As new technology options become available, we have worked to increase our capabilities, and were delighted when alumnus and longtime supporter, Mr. Harry Davis, made a substantial donation to the school that will enable us to install wireless internet and new classroom equipment. While internet has been available across campus for years, there are many advantages to a wireless system, including increased student involvement using their own devices as a learning tool. Our deep appreciation is extended to Mr. Davis for his generosity.

In the area of technology, we also launched Fuqua School's new website, which received excited feedback from the school community. Through the work of our Director of Communications, Linda Davis, in concert with the company Magic Hour, the new website is striking and easy for visitors to navigate. Part of the excitement stemmed from the athletics module that helps the school better organize and display sports schedules and game results, provide improved directions to opponent locations, and highlight the great programs and coaching staff at the school. February brought a very special recognition to Fuqua School. Band Director Camille Rabon was named Middle School Teacher of the Year for the Commonwealth of Virginia by the Veterans of Foreign Wars. Nominations for this prestigious honor were submitted by 60 VFW posts across the Commonwealth in recognition of exceptional teaching. Mrs. Rabon has brought a new level of excellence to the band program at Fuqua School since joining the faculty in 2011, including the creation of a cross-curricular Veterans Day celebration that has encouraged participation from the entire student body in paying tribute to the men and women who have served our country in the armed forces. Our highest commendations are extended to Mrs. Rabon for this outstanding accomplishment!

Mrs. Rabon's students also excelled! Eighty-five band students from Fuqua School in grades 5 through 8 participated in the Music in the Parks competition in Williamsburg where thirteen instrumental ensembles represented schools from Virginia, North Carolina, Delaware, Maryland, New York and Pennsylvania. Both of our bands received a rating of excellent. We were especially pleased that, in addition to the first place trophies, Fuqua School was presented the Esprit de Corps Award, which celebrates spirit, positive conduct, enthusiasm, performance and appearance.

Clearly, our students never cease to amaze me, but the efforts of two seniors in establishing a Model United Nations program for Southside Virginia were unprecedented. Jacob Miller and Peyton Wall were told that Fuqua School would be unable to create a Model United Nations club due to the school's distance from any conferences. Rather than lose hope, these determined students reached out to Hampden-Sydney College, and through the collaboration of Hampden-Sydney's Wilson Center for Leadership in the Public

Interest and The Union Philanthropic Literary Society, their vision became reality. Fifty-six high school students from thirteen schools, independent and public, from the surrounding counties participated in this first annual Model United Nations conference. During the three-day event and under the leadership of Hampden-Sydney students, participants learned the functions and responsibilities of the United Nations, current events occurring around the globe, and diplomatic solutions to solving problems. Numerous topics of debate that impact more than twenty countries were covered, helping students gain a new perspective on global issues. As we look to the future, The Wilson Center hopes to make the Model United Nations an annual event in partnership with Fuqua School.

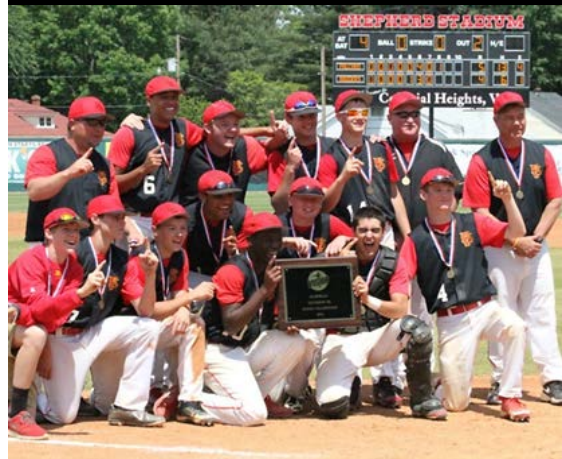
Once again, Fuqua School's Youth in Government students excelled at the Virginia YMCA sponsored Model General Assembly (MGA) on the Capitol grounds in Richmond. The MGA is designed to introduce high school students to the legislative process of the Commonwealth. Fuqua students proposed two bills, one of which passed both houses of the General Assembly and was signed by the youth governor. Fuqua School senior Whitney Forlines, elected previously as the 2014 Lieutenant Governor, ran debate for three days in the Virginia Senate, where she ensured decorum and conducted the primary elections for MGA offices for 2015. We were thrilled that one of our students, Cali Foster, was elected by the MGA students to serve as the 2015 Lieutenant Governor, marking the fourth year in a row that Fuqua School has had an elected leader of the House or Senate. We are indebted to our upper school teacher, Mr. Jennings Custis, for the tremendous role he has played over the years in the success of our students who attend MGA.

And to our delight, we ended the year with an athletic State Championship! Fuqua School's varsity baseball team, led by Coach Ted Cunningham, represented our school at the Virginia Independent Schools Athletic Association (VISAA) Division III State Championship game on Sunday, May 18, at Shepherd Stadium in Colonial Heights, returning home with the title. Our Falcons played with great determination and skill, defeating Southampton Academy.

In April, I announced my upcoming retirement from Fuqua School, effective July 31, 2015. It has truly been my privilege to serve as president of this wonderful institution for the past twenty years and to have had the opportunity to honor and help bring to life the vision of our benefactor, Mr. J.B. Fuqua. Working together, we have built a school that reflects warmth and openness and challenges each student to achieve his or her boundless individual potential. My deepest appreciation is extended to the many people who have supported the school during my tenure, and I look forward to keeping abreast of the many new happenings at Fuqua School from my home in North Carolina.

2014 COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

JON MARTIN '97



WELCOME BACK...



Keeping with the longstanding tradition of inviting alumni to deliver the commencement address, this year's guest speaker was Mr. Jon Martin, son of Mr. and Mrs. David Martin of Farmville. Jon is a 1997 graduate of Fuqua School and was inducted into the Fuqua School Athletics Hall of Fame in 2011. Jon received his Master of Education, Educational Leadership with emphasis in Sports Management, in 2003 from Lynchburg College.

Jon, Head Baseball Coach and Facilities Coordinator at Vassar College in Poughkeepsie, NY, manages all facets of a NCAA Division III college baseball program. During his tenure, Jon has designed and facilitated the construction of a multi-million dollar on-campus baseball facility and coached 10 All-New York Region, 35 All-Liberty League players, one LL Player of the Year, one LL Rookie of the Year and six professional players. Under Jon's leadership, baseball has set more than 30 new Vassar College single season records as well as 13 career records in 2010, 2011, and 2013.

Jon shared, "After graduating from Lynchburg College in 2001 and realizing that I wanted to stay in baseball to make a living, I approached my head coach and convinced him to add me to his staff. I was fortunate to learn the game, learn how to lead, and learn how to teach for the next two years under his tutelage. I was also able to complete my master's degree and find the job that I currently have at Vassar.

I have been fortunate enough to represent Vassar College for almost 10 years. We have built a new top-of-the-line baseball facility, set numerous program records, and had several players continue on to play professional baseball. I've also had the honor and privilege to manage teams for USA Baseball several times and have represented our country overseas. I was part of a team that won a gold medal in the Robur '58 Tournament in Amsterdam, Netherlands. These are memories and experiences that I will always cherish and which were beyond my wildest dreams.

"If I didn't find my love for baseball while playing at Fuqua, none of this would have become a reality. It all started there, on Gilmer Field, and I can't wait to come back for commencement and share some of my experiences in baseball, travel, and life. I hope I can inspire this class to chase dreams, think for themselves, and experience what the world has to offer. "

- upgrading technology available to students both inside and outside the classroom, which enriches the learning experience and provides essential technological skills needed to flourish in the world's expanding information age.

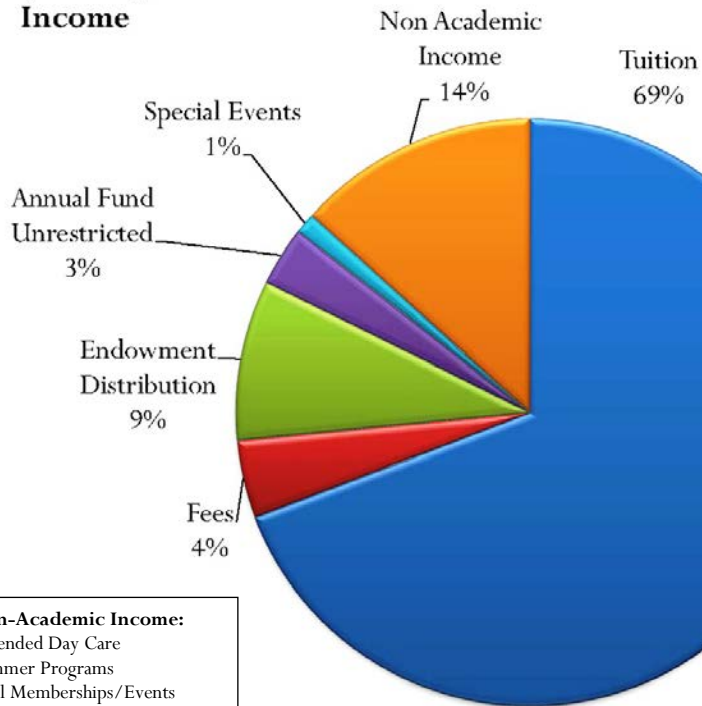

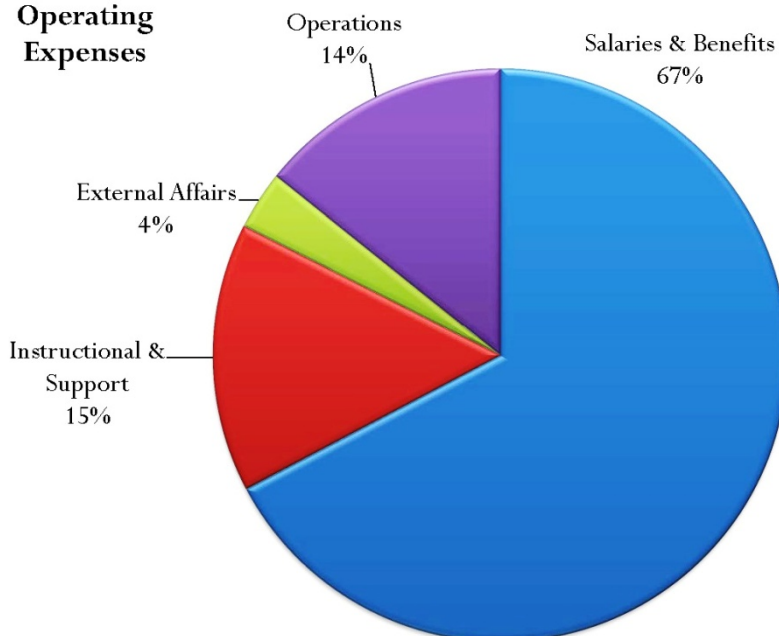
2013-2014 OPERATING INCOME & EXPENSE

MANY WAYS TO GIVE ~ ALL TAX DEDUCTIBLE

CASH/CHECK:

A cash contribution may entitle you to an income tax deduction in the year of the gift, depending upon your specific tax situation.

CREDIT CARD:

Paying by VISA, MasterCard, or Discover allows you to take advantage of your card's rewards programs. If you would like to make your payments over time, we can set up a monthly or quarterly recurring gift.

APPRECIATED SECURITIES:

Appreciated securities are often preferred vehicles because they may entitle you to an income tax charitable deduction for the fair market value of the securities and, in certain situations, the avoidance of capital gains tax. Consult your tax advisor for details.

MATCHING GIFTS:

Corporate matching gifts are an easy way for you to increase the impact of your personal contribution. By taking advantage of a company's matching gift program, you can generate an additional gift that may automatically double or triple your own contribution. You will receive full credit for both the original donation and the matching gift. A matching gift form should accompany your initial contribution.

PLANNED GIFTS:

Gifts made through bequests and estate planning help ensure Fuqua's future and may offer significant tax advantages and income rights for the life of the donor and/or the donor's beneficiary. Bequests are designated for the School's Endowment Fund, where they will provide for the long-term future of the School.

Fuqua School's transportation system is vital to the school's successful operation. Transportation is provided for approximately 200 students to and from school from August through May, using eight buses that collectively travel 625 miles daily. The geographical area traveled includes 11 counties and covers approximately 120 miles north to south and 70 miles east to west. Our central pick-up location system reduces wear and tear on buses and is cost effective. With the inclusion of field trips and transportation to athletic events, the fleet, comprising 16 vehicles, travels more than 145,000 miles annually.

A good preventive maintenance program is in place; all vehicles are tuned twice a year by Fuqua school mechanics using a detailed check list. Vehicles are given a bumper to bumper inspection during the months of June, July, and August, and any needed repairs are made; vehicles are then scheduled for the annual State Inspection which is done by an independent inspection station. Vehicles are inspected again in the month of December by Fuqua School mechanics. Drivers are responsible for daily checks of their respective vehicles. Through prompt reporting of problems, potential mechanical failures are typically identified before they result in break downs. In addition, bi-weekly checks of the fleet are conducted by our mechanics. These measures have resulted in less than one break down per quarter with students stranded away from school.

Our bus drivers are extremely committed to their responsibility of transporting students safely. A set of school bus rules are in place to ensure safety and there have been few minor incidents and no major incidents. The minor incidents were handled swiftly and, with the cooperation of school staff and parents, there are few repeats. The key to the overall success is the cooperation of drivers, staff, management, and most importantly, parents.
