# Young Writers' Day

There is more to writing than 2<sup>nd</sup> grade animal projects and 4<sup>th</sup> grade biographies! Young Writers' Day was a day for Manoa scholars to learn about all different kinds of writing. Over 20 writers came to Manoa this year including authors' of books, reporters, poets, song writers and story tellers.





We learned about different types of writing and different mediums for writing. We heard how writers follow their interests, and we even learned a little bit about the process of getting a book published.

The day ended with a great assembly.



We interviewed teachers in every grade to find out:



#### Kindergarten

In LA students are learning about nonfiction. They are learning about frogs and whales. They are researching and then the kids will have to write a report on what they have learned!

In Math the kindergarten students are learning how to count to twenty using tools including a rekenrek and number dots.

Kindergartners are excited for the 100th day of school! They will make a poster with 100 things on it. Another exciting thing coming up is a trip to the high school in February.

# What's going on around Manoa?

#### First Grade

In Math students are learning about ordinal numbers. In LA they're learning about short and long vowels, inferencing, and that stories have a problem and solution. In science they are learning about weather, the water cycle, and the seasons.

Mrs. DeFruscio reports that she is looking forward to winning a silver award and a field trip in February.





#### Second Grade

Mrs. Cirillo reports that she is very excited for the Immigration Project. We are multiplying and working on measurements in Math.

Second graders have also started using computers to research projects and are learning computer programming in Library. In pair programming 2nd graders work together. The driver controls the computer and the navigator helps the driver. Communication is key!

#### Third Grade

Nathan talked to Mrs. Donovan about some of the upcoming Events in the 3rd grade. In Social Studies they are learning about Jamestown and the early U.S. colonists. In science they will soon get plants that they will grow.



In LA 3<sup>rd</sup> graders are learning how to write a realistic fiction story. They are also finishing writing biographies.

Finally, in math they are learning about bar graphs and line plots, and multiplication.

According to Mr. Feldgus:


**Q:** What is coming up in science? **A:** Electricity
