





#### Mock Trial Takes 1st and 2nd Place in UPenn Tournament

The Roman Catholic Mock Trial Team had a successful weekend competing in the University of Pennsylvania's Ben Franklin Invitational. Roman entered four teams: The Varsity A, B, C, and D teams, and every team finished with a winning record. The A Team compiled a perfect 8-0 record, capturing first place in the tournament. The D Team continued their recent run of success, finishing 8-0 and taking home second place. The B Team finished 6-2 and just narrowly missed placing due to tiebreakers. Several individual awards were given to Roman students as well. Tim Krapp '21 and Anthony Kafel '20 were presented with Best Witness Awards, while Nick Hamilton '19 was awarded a Best Attorney Award. The team looks to continue their success at the City Tournament, which begins on Friday at the Criminal Justice Center.





## SPEAKER: ARTHUR M. NEZU, PH.D., DHL, ABPP

Arthur M. Nezu, Ph.D., DHL, ABPP, is a Distinguished University Professor of Psychology, professor of medicine, and professor of public health at Drexel University. He is also co-director of New Beginnings, a free, community-based program aimed at reducing suicide risk among U.S. veterans. A licensed and triple-board certified psychologist and elected fellow of multiple psychological associations, he has published close to 250 journal articles and book chapters, as well as 24 books. Dr. Nezu was a member of the APA expert panel that developed Clinical Practice Guidelines for the treatment of depression. He is a recipient of multiple awards for his research and professional contributions. The American Board of Professional Psychology also named an annual award in his honor that is given to a recent doctoral degree recipient whose dissertation addresses multicultural diversity.

## DONDERO AWARD RECIPIENT: DIANE M. UNGVARSKY, MPHIL, '84

Diane M. Ungvarsky, MPhil, '84, is a Research Psychologist for the U.S. Army Research Laboratory (ARL), Human Research and Engineering Directorate, and a co-chair of the ARL Institutional Review Board (IRB). Her research interests include human performance, robotics and artificial intelligence, cyber operations, and women in the military. Her awards include the Commander's Award for Public Service Medal, the Achievement Medal for Civilian Service, the ARL HRED 2017 Award for Partnering, and the Order of St. Joan D'Arc Medallion.
