Parking Lot Follow Up- Safety concern is <u>still</u> an issue. Frustrations brought up that we have not seen the plans as decided back at the beginning of the year.

ILP Conferences- Confused about what to expect at an ILP, especially when its an open house style. Our plan is to make it clear between all staff on what to expect at an ILP. Is this a time to celebrate the student, bring up concerns with academics and behavior? Mrs. Hammer will come up with a statement that is unified between all teachers for ILP conferences.

Open House style- Teachers had mixed feelings. Biggest dislike was the unprepared and impersonal feeling when a student walks in without knowledge they will be there right then. The teachers prefer to be prepared for that specific student to come in. Mrs. Hammer will send out a survey to gather information about the parents' thoughts.

Planning Ahead/ Back to School- Need to consider if we are doing a back to school night before school starts, or if we should have it after school starts. Will be doing back to school night rather than a back to school morning (as decided by parent survey). Schedule will follow the same as it has been, with the title 1 presentation first, followed by 2 sessions of the teacher presentations.

SIP Goals-

1. SPIRE Goal- Increase from 66% to 69% in pathways to progress. The data window just closed, so Mrs. Hammer will show that data at our next meeting. SPIRE was purchased from eps school specialty; it is a reading intervention that fills the gaps that our students have.
