Our Goals for Student Achievement

District Goals

- New Hanover County Schools will achieve 85% proficiency as measured by EOG and EOC test results within the next 3-5 years.

School Goals

- Pine Valley Elementary met growth expectations for the 2017-2018 school year. We will continue to strive for high growth at all grade levels and in all subject levels.

3rd Grade Goals

- Demonstrate reading accuracy and comprehension at a minimum of level P on the TRC assessment.
- Achieve an Oral Reading Fluency goal of at least 110 words per minute.
- Achieve at least 85% proficiency on basic addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division facts.
- 80% of more of 3rd grade students will be proficient on EOG tests in both math and reading.

In the Classroom

Teachers will work with students and their families to support students' academic success. Some of the main instructional focuses at Pine Valley include

- Creating independent readers who are able to decode, read fluently, and comprehend what they read
- Developing fluency and accuracy with basic math facts
- Using models and manipulatives to help students gain a conceptual understanding of math
- Using hands-on materials and technology to facilitate science instruction
- Using Read to Achieve passages to instruct and collect assessment data to focus instruction
- Implement whole grade iReady instruction

At Home

Teachers work with families to support students' academic success in and outside the classroom. Some ways families of third graders at Pine Valley can support their children include

- Read with your child every day for 20 minutes and ask comprehension questions.
- Review work that is sent home.
- Attend parent meetings and workshops.
- Give rewards based on GROWTH not specifically high grades, creating an opportunity for enthusiasm instead of anxiety.
- Remain in communication with the teacher at all times and make sure that they are aware that you are open to comments/suggestions.
- Be supportive and actively aware of my child at school by having discussions of what is going on at school.
