General Diploma Information



What is the required program of study in the IB Diploma Program?

- IB Diploma candidates take courses from each of the six subject groups for both years.
 - Group 1 – **Studies in Language and Literature**
 - Group 2 – **Language Acquisition**
 - Group 3 – **Individuals and Societies**
 - Group 4 – **Experimental Sciences**
 - Group 5 – **Mathematics**
 - Group 6 – **The Arts** or optional sixth IB subject
- And complete the Diploma Program Core: **Extended Essay**, **Theory of Knowledge** and **Creativity, Action and Service (CAS)**



How is the IB Diploma determined?

- Each IB course is scored on a 1-7 scale (this score includes internal and external assessments)
- Students must score a minimum total of **12** on the HL exams and **9** on the SL exams and **24** points on exams overall to earn the IB Diploma
- The average score at the IA for the 2013 class was **32**
- The highest score possible is **45**

General Information regarding IA requirements and registration

- All IB courses are two-year courses except for Environmental Systems and Societies
- Students cannot switch to a different IB course senior year. The IB requires that students are in each course for two years to allow time to cover the curriculum and complete the internal assessments.
- All students will take a minimum of six IB courses in junior and senior year.
- Students are not guaranteed that they will get their first choices. Placement will be done by timestamp from the online form submission. **Please note that any changes to the original registration will be placed on the placement list via the last or latest time stamp.** Changing a registration form will move a student down the placement list. This is also true for changes over the summer.

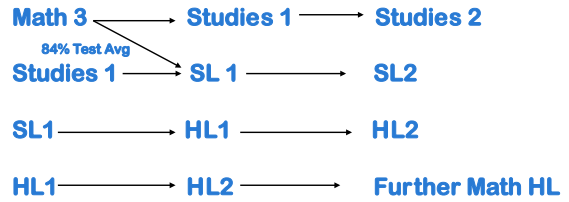
All courses are taught at the **HL level** and are two (2) year courses of study

- Physics

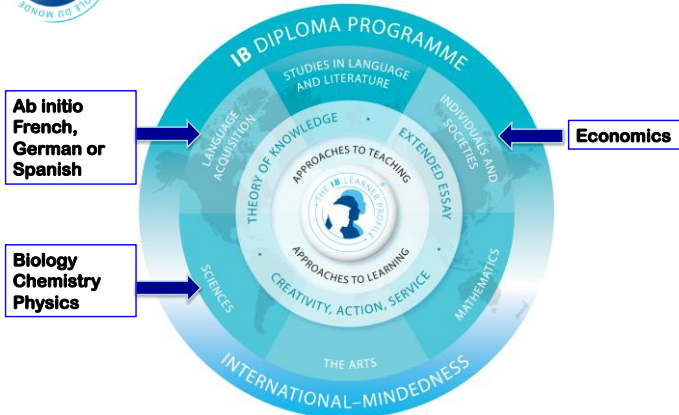


Mathematics
