## **STATEMENT OF BOARDING PRINCIPLES AND PRACTICE**

The school's boarding principles and practice echo those laid out in the Staff Handbook, under 'Statement of Principles and Practice.'

### **Principles & Aims:**

- To ensure a safe environment where each pupils' health, welfare and general well-being is paramount.
- To develop the individual spiritually, culturally, morally and socially.
- To foster an open and trusting environment, based upon mutual respect.
- To uphold the right to work, rest and play free from abuse, intimidation, harassment, teasing and bullying.
- To provide equal opportunities and tolerance for all, regardless of ethnicity, culture or disability.
- To acknowledge the right to privacy within reason.
- To promote intellectual development in an atmosphere that is conducive to work and that values effort.
- To develop the pupils' responsibility for themselves, for their actions, and for others.
- To develop their leadership and teamwork.
- To deliver provision that at least meets the National Minimum Boarding Standards and where possible exceeds them.

In order to achieve these aims it is important to understand and react to the needs of the pupils and their parents. The School prides itself on fostering a family atmosphere and approach to its pupils and members of the House pastoral team hold direct responsibility for their charges; their welfare and well-being should take paramount priority.

Communication is essential. The Housemaster is the lynch-pin for disseminating information, and all significant actions of a disciplinary nature should be sanctioned by him. All communications of a business nature should be referred to him. He also deals with the prefects on a formal basis.
