# Superintendent Recommendation



Improve the middle school experience by transitioning 6th graders to a more ageand academicappropriate environment at the middle school.



- CMS will be an updated learning environment with new classrooms, a collaborative learning space and building-wide updates.
- Students will have stronger performing arts opportunities with a full performing arts space for school and community-wide use and a new music rehearsal space.
- Traffic flow will be improved and safer for student pick up and drop off.
- Students will eat lunch over a typical lunch period through the expansion of the cafeteria, which prevents lunch periods from starting at 10 a.m.
- Choices for each student that also strengthen the immersion experience.



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**Transition** 4-year-old preschool to the elementary schools to ensure more children are kindergarten ready and reading by third grade.



- Improved traffic flow with the reduction of 6th grade and preschool starting on a separate schedule as the rest of the school.
- Students are more academically, socially and emotionally prepared for kindergarten by experiencing preschool in the same building as K-5.
- Preschool and kindergarten teachers will regularly collaborate to ensure student success.
  - Preschool students will ride a dedicated preschool bus to school.
  - Updated facilities where appropriate.
  - Choices for each student.

#### Amend/Add an Agenda Item

#### **Amend an Agenda**

The Chair, Vice Chair and Superintendent draft an agenda during an agenda setting meeting, noting changes from the approved Board Work Plan. The Board can approve or amend this agenda during agenda approval.

- Any Board Director can make a motion to amend an agenda (Board Directors may notify their fellow members ahead of time that they would like to amend the agenda.)
  - a. The Board can vote to oppose the amendment, and the item may instead be added to the Board Work Plan
  - b. The Board can accept the proposed amendment
    - i. By majority vote if *draft* agenda, by 2/3 vote if *approved* agenda
- 2. Committee Updates
  - a. Adding Committee meeting minutes
    - Before an agenda setting meeting, send committee minutes to Board Administrative Assistant to add to agenda (and copy Board Chair)
    - ii. If after agenda setting meeting, follow procedure for "Amend an Agenda"
  - b. Request for Board Action, recommendation or feedback (5-minute discussion)
    - i. If the issue is resolved, no further action is needed
    - ii. If the issue is not resolved
      - 1. Add to Board Work Plan slate
      - 2. Send issue back to committee for refinement

#### Add an Item to the Board Work Plan

Any Board Director may request that one or more topics be added to the Board Work Plan.

- 1. If a majority of Board agrees to the addition(s), the item(s) are added.
- 2. The Clerk or Chair restates the slate for clarity, and the Board votes to approve or reject the amended Board Work Plan.

#### **Board Officer Election Process**

There are four Board Officer positions: Chair, Vice Chair, Treasurer and Clerk. Officers are elected by the Board to serve a term of one year. Any Board Director may seek nomination for and election to a Board Officer position using the following process:

- 1. Executive Assistant sends this document to Board members and Board-elects by December 15th announcing that nominations are open for Board Officer positions.
- 2. Ten days prior to the first meeting in January, a Board Director, interested in seeking election to a Board Officer position, sends an email to the Executive Assistant stating their intent to seek nomination.
- 3. The Executive Assistant forwards the Board Director's intent to seek nomination to the other Board Directors.
- 4. At the first Board Business meeting in January, each Board Director is elected in order, beginning with the Board Chair.

#### **Board Chair:**

The seated Board Vice-Chair presides over the election of the new Board Chair using the following process:

#### **Nomination:**

Each Board Director seeking to hold the office may either be nominated by a fellow Board Director, or may nominate themselves.

#### Second:

A nomination must be seconded by another director to proceed to a vote.

#### **Nominee Statement:**

Each nominee may make a brief statement as to their qualifications for the office.

#### Vote:

Each nomination is put to a vote by written ballot. The top two vote getters move on to a second round of voting. Voting continues until one nominee receives a majority of the votes. The Board Chair elect immediately assumes their office and performs its duties.

#### **Board Vice Chair, Board Treasurer, Board Clerk:**

The newly elected Board Chair presides over the election of the remaining Board Officers, in order, using the same process as above. Each newly elected Board Officer immediately assumes their office and its duties.

5. The elected Board Officers perform the duties of their office until the end of their term.

Absences must be communicated to the Board Chair or Committee Chair at least seventy-two hours prior to the affected meeting. In the case of an unforeseen conflict, the Board Chair or Committee Chair must be notified as soon as possible.

#### Propose Re-numbering Child Policy for GP 4.5.5 as follows:

- **GP 4.5.6** Members will be properly prepared for School Board deliberation.
- GP 4.5.7 Members will support the legitimacy and authority of the final determination
  of the School Board on any matter, irrespective of the member's personal position on

### **≠** TOBACCO21:

WHEREAS, tobacco use is the foremost preventable cause of premature death in the United States,<sup>1</sup> responsible for approximately 480,000 deaths a year<sup>2</sup> and 20.8 million premature deaths in the U.S. over the past 50 years since the first


Surgeon General's report on smoking in 1964;<sup>3</sup> WHEREAS, the annual economic impact of smoking in the U.S. is more than \$300 billion in health care and lost worker productivity costs;<sup>4</sup>

WHEREAS, national data show that about 95 percent of adult smokers begin smoking before they turn 21, and that the ages of 18 to 21 are a critical period when many smokers move from experimental smoking to regular, daily use;<sup>5</sup>

WHEREAS, the developing brains of young people are particularly susceptible to the addictive properties of nicotine,<sup>6</sup> and as a result, approximately 3 out of 4 teen smokers end up smoking into adulthood;<sup>7</sup> WHEREAS, electronic smoking device use among minors has recently tripled;<sup>8</sup>

WHEREAS, a 2015 Institute of Medicine report concludes that raising the minimum legal sales age for tobacco products nationwide will reduce tobacco initiation, particularly among adolescents aged 15 to 17, and that it will improve health across the lifespan and save lives; and that raising the minimum legal sales age for tobacco products to 21 nationwide would, over time, lead to a 12 percent decrease in smoking prevalence;<sup>9</sup>

WHEREAS, the Institute of Medicine also predicts that raising the minimum legal sales age for tobacco products to 21 nationwide would result in 223,000 fewer premature deaths, 50,000 fewer deaths from lung cancer, and 4.2 million fewer years of life lost for those born between 2000 and 2019, and that it would result in near immediate reductions in preterm birth, low birth weight, and sudden infant death syndrome;<sup>10</sup>



WHEREAS, a growing number of communities have enacted laws mandating a minimum legal sales age for tobacco products to 21,<sup>11</sup> including the states of Hawaii and California;<sup>12</sup> WHEREAS, three-quarters of U.S. adults favor raising the MLSA for tobacco products to 21, including seven in ten smokers;<sup>13</sup> WHEREAS, the retail impact of ordinances mandating a minimum legal sales age of 21 for tobacco products is expected to be minimal in the first years of the policy because it works by reducing or delaying initiation of smoking, especially among younger populations;<sup>14</sup> WHEREAS, raising the legal drinking age to 21 led to reduced alcohol use and dependence among

youth, and contributed to a decline in drunk driving fatalities;<sup>15</sup>

WHEREAS, the health and safety of Eden Prairie School students is a top priority and community and school values need to be aligned in dealing with this epidemic;

RESOLVED, Eden Prairie School Board recommends that Eden Prairie raise the minimum legal sales age for tobacco products to 21.

#### **School Board Brief**

#### Learning to Read, Reading to Learn

What does the Eden Prairie School Board do? As elected officials, we fulfill the tasks delegated to us by the State of Minnesota while representing the voice and values of our community. One of those tasks is to set outcomes (Ends policies) for the district that reflect community educational values.

Ends Policy 1.1.1 states the expectation that "each student is reading at grade level by the end of third grade." Why is this an important outcome for our district? Third grade is viewed as a pivotal year for reading. Up to that point, students are learning to read; following that, they are reading to learn. As a district, we keep class sizes small in K-2 to give each student optimal opportunity to learn important reading skills. Reading by third grade has been correlated with higher student achievement, higher high school graduation rates, and greater career success.

During our recent monitoring of End 1.1.1, our Superintendent asserted:

"Over the past three years, we have seen an increase in literacy achievement as measured by a triangulated measurement of three assessment methodologies. This year we met the 2017-2018 target of 78.2% of students proficient in two of three measures. This is the first group of students to have experienced the reduced class sizes from the referendum and our results have climbed from 71.8% to 78.2% since implementing this measure."

Our district remains committed to each student reaching their highest potential, and reading is a key that opens up the world of learning.

### Proposed Performance Plan Goals 2018-2019

The following objective and subjective goals and tasks will be assessed by the board in November 2019 per the contract. The goals address the areas of student achievement, strategic leadership tasks, and fiscal health of the district. The board will evaluate the achievement or completion of the goals and tasks during the superintendent's annual review.

#### 1. Student Achievement Goal: 25% of the Plan

- a) The 2018 3rd Grade Reading, as measured by the triangulated metric used within Ends 1.1.1, will increase from 78.2% to 80%.
- b) The 2018 graduation rate, excluding students who require 18-21 transition programming or ELL services, will increase through a reduction in the percentage continuing credit recovery or unknown from 4.9% to 3% as measured by End 1.1.

#### 2. Strategic Task: 25% of the Plan

Goal: Bring the Designing Pathways phase II facilities process to a close and begin to implement a plan, which supports our mission and achievement of our ends through personalized learning, provides appropriate space for EC-12 learners, increases facility physical safety and security, and strategically positions the district for the future. The goal will be measured through securing appropriate funds to move the current plan forward or through the development of a process and plan to achieve the stated goals.

#### 3. Strategic Task: 25% of the Plan

Goal: Expand the initial set of online learning courses with supplemental status as approved by MDE from 2 to 12, as measured by a list of Eden Prairie Schools online courses with MDE approval.

#### 4. Fiscal Health: 25% of the Plan

Goal: Implement recommendations of our research based EC-12 engagement plan. This will be measured by evidence of task completion and presentation of the comprehensive strategies.
