# Types of Colleges

- Four Year State Colleges
  - 17 College Prep Units, SAT/ACTs, State College GPA
- Four Year Private Colleges
- Two Year Colleges
  - Transfer Options
- Technical Schools

## Where should I apply?

- What to consider?
  - Majors
  - Acceptance Rates
  - Location
  - School size
  - Support Services
  - Sports/Activities
  - Financial Aid Reputation
  - General Feeling about the school
- Your student will be working on this list using the website Naviance with his/her Guidance Counselor
  - Your student can also make an appointment with her/her Guidance Counselor to compose and discuss this list

#### How many should I apply to?

- 6-8 Colleges
  - Reach
  - Realistic
  - Safety
  - Financial Safety

#### Timeline

- Now!
  - Create a list of potential schools with counselor and Naviance
  - Start researching colleges on the list: GO visit!
  - Follow the College Planning timeline
  - SATs or ACTs(if needed): SAT prep Starting in Feb.
  - Think about Fall/Winter SAT Dates: October, November, December and January

#### Fall 2019 - Apply to college!

- Meet with Guidance Counselor to revisit college list
  - Make adjustments as necessary
- Attend Keefe Tech College Visits
- Create an account with Common Application\*
- Take SAT/ACT (again)
- Compose personal essay in English class
- Update resume
- Ask teachers for letters of recommendation
  - At least two
- Attend Financial Aid Night at Keefe
- Create a FSA ID and password on the FSA website https://fsaid.ed.gov

#### Decisions, Decisions, Decisions...

- There are different types of admissions policies.....BE AWARE!
  - Early Action Apply early, receive a decision early. Not Binding!
  - Early Decision Apply to one school early and if accepted....YOU MUST ATTEND (if provides adequate financial aid).

#### Decisions, Decisions, Decisions...

- Rolling Decision
  - Decisions are made when students application is complete. No specific deadline.
- Regular Decision
  - Applications must be complete by designated date by college.

#### What the Application Consists Of:

- Completed Application (3 Types)
  - paper, online, common application
- Essay
  - Autobiographical, original, or application specific
- Letters of Recommendation (2 recommended)
  - At least one academic teacher recommendation\*
- Resume
- Transcript
  - Sent through the Guidance Office using Naviance\*
- 1st trimester grades
- SAT or ACT scores
  - Sent from Collegeboard or ACT
  - Additional information if requested by a college
  - Additional Essays, Letters of Rec, or other materials

#### Paying for College

- Financial Aid (FAFSA)
  - Keefe Tech Financial Aid Workshop
  - MEFA Representative presents
- Scholarships
  - Students attended Workshop at Keefe
  - Complete Scholarship Packet (February)

# January - March 2020

- Look out for financial aid deadlines.
- FAFSA will be looking at 2018 tax year.
- Complete FAFSA according to earliest financial aid deadline.
- Some private schools may require the CSS Profile.

### Accessing Support in College

- If your student is on an IEP, he/she can still access support at the postsecondary level
- The IEP will end when a student graduates high school
- Disabilities are protected in college by the ADA not IDEA.
- Every school has an Office of Disability Services
- It's your responsibility to provide documentation,
   e.g. most recent SPED testing.
- Different colleges offer more than others, e.g. PAL Program, Landmark College, etc.
- Your student must seek out these supports\*
