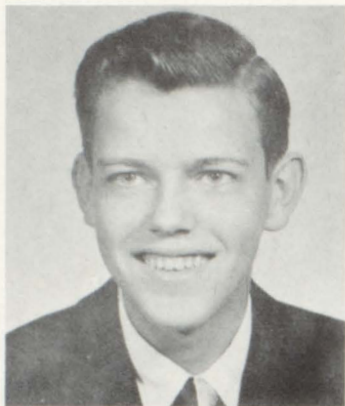

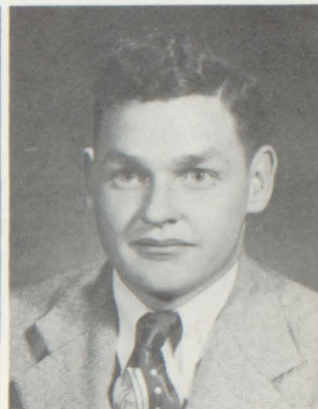

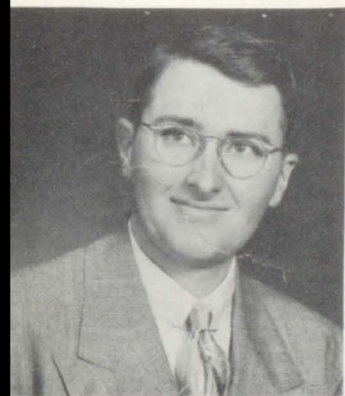

Entering senior high was quite a thrill to us because now we were considered full-fledged students. There was rejoicing when Janet Harwood became Homecoming attendant. Five girls took part in the prom a year ahead of time; they had the honor of serving punch. This is the year that Lorraine Case returned.

The final two games, which they lost 32-6, and Charles, which was a 1951 season.

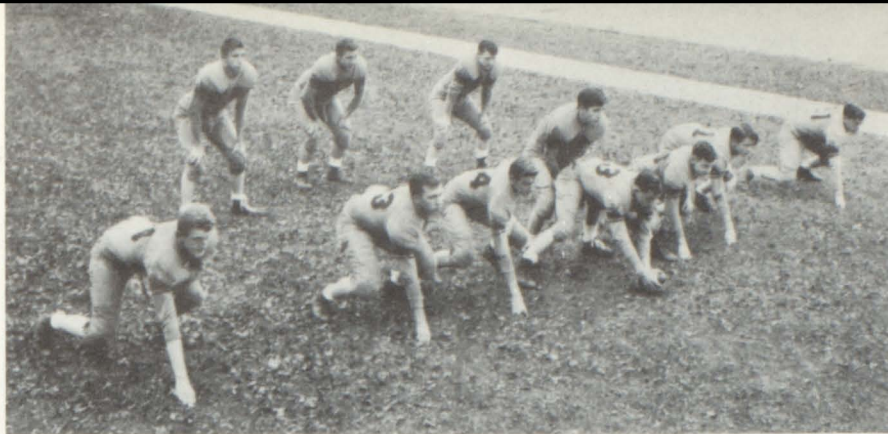

and Harmony but the remainder of the season was quite dismal as the Gophers paid the ultimate to the other teams of the district.

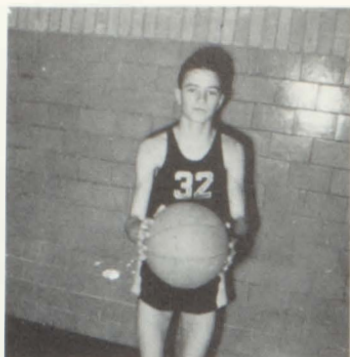
