




Dedication

Class History

We had a choice of typing, shop, geometry, or Spanish I as our one elective in our sophomore year. We enlarged our numbers again with the arrival of Rodney Copeman and Marvin Modeen.

Our junior year found us very busy. We put on the junior class play, "Coming Round the Mountain." Our prom, "Moonlight on Hawaii," was a huge success also. Class rings added much to our prestige. Conrad Fingerson and Mona Nading increased our class by two.

September 5, 1956, brought the day we had all been dreaming of. We were seniors! Wilma Winger and Elisabeth Herren, an exchange student from Switzerland, concluded the additional members of the class of '57. Before we could get really settled, we were off to Winona for senior pictures. King Larry Halloran and Queen Susan Martin reigned over the Homecoming festivities. The senior float, "Columbus Discovered 'Em, Let's Smother 'Em," won first prize. Each event of the year became more meaningful with the knowledge it was our last time to participate.


Basketball

The Gophers lose three from their squad this year through graduation--Harley Olstad, Gary Miller, and Larry Halloran.


