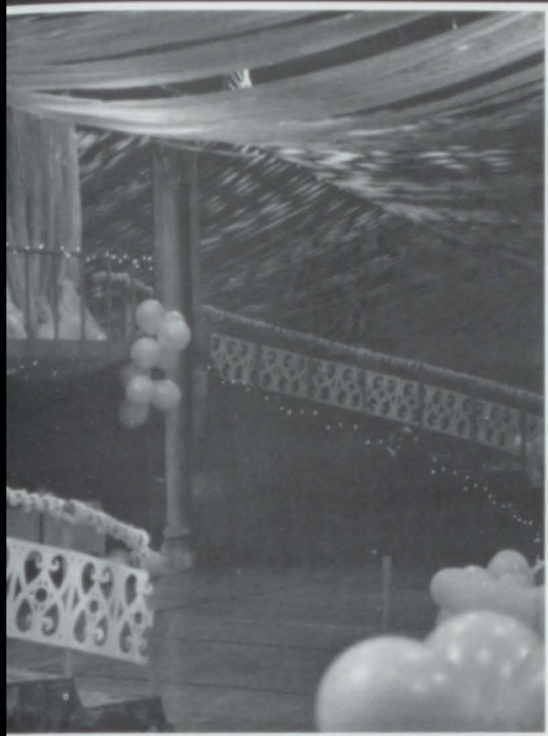

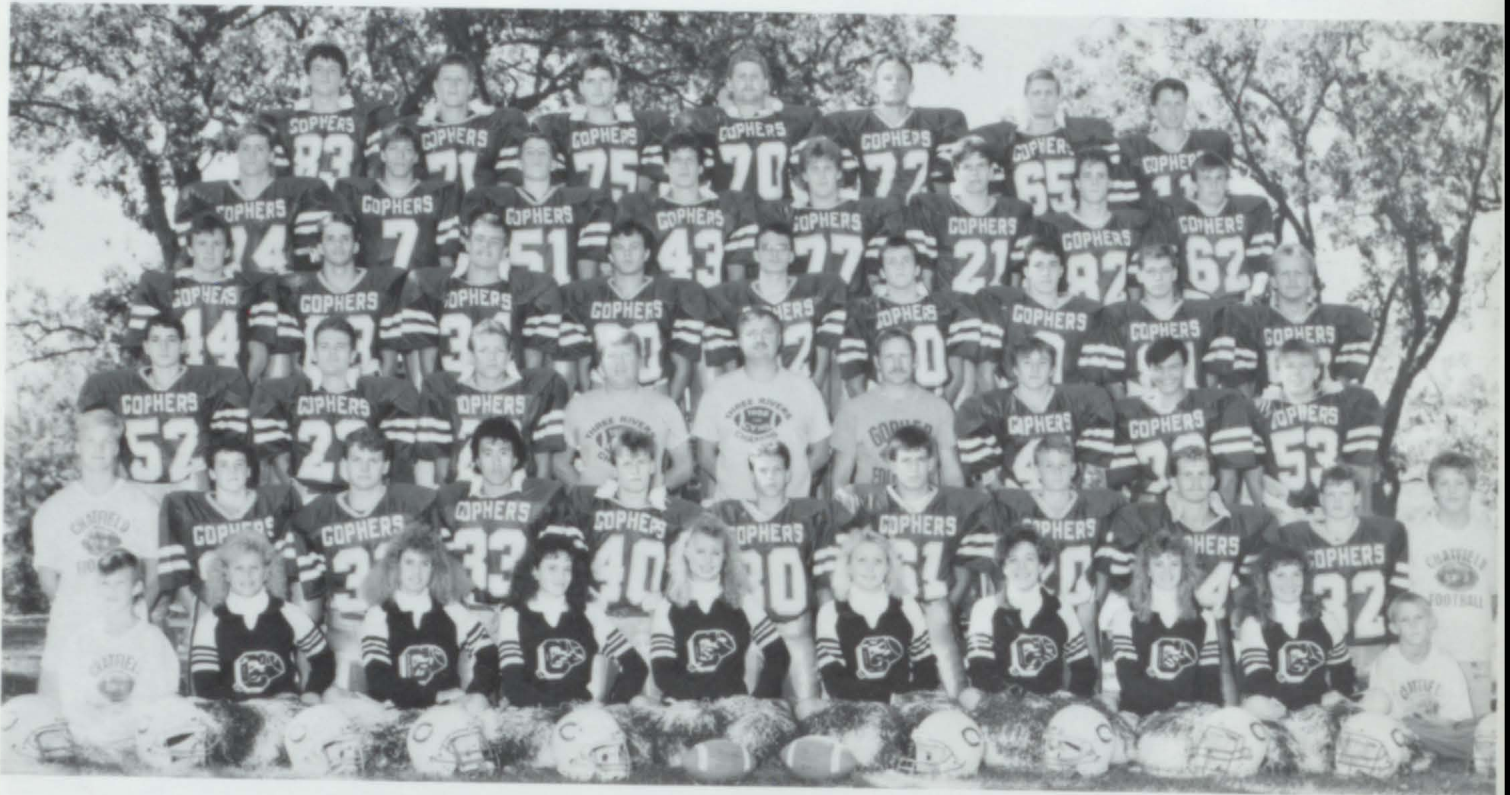
Go to any away game and you know instantly where the Chatfield side is. It is the one with all the people! That says something about our school, our fine athletic program, and most of all our fine athletes.

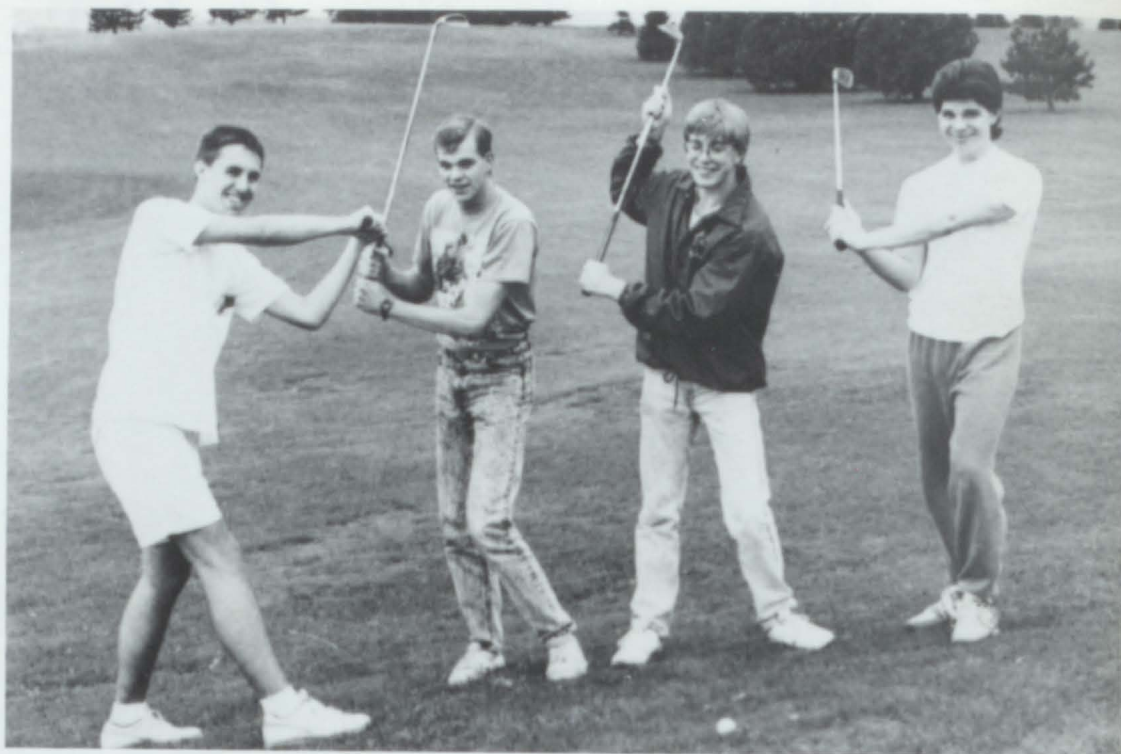

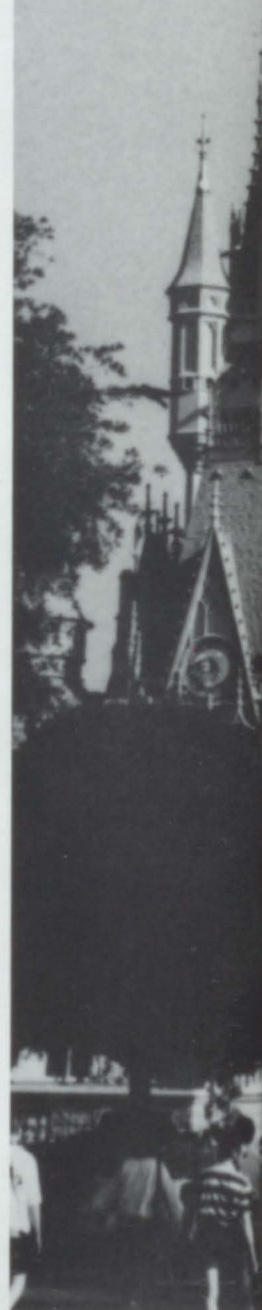

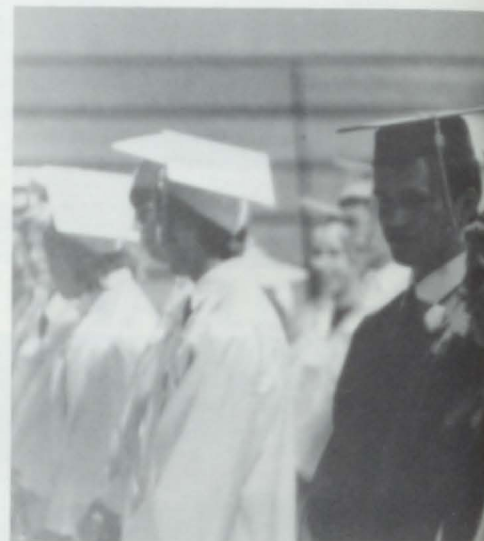
