Reports

Green Team: Advisor Nora Gathje, Maddie Collett, Katie Ihrke, Sabina Boettcher & Ann Warren: This team was formed in Mrs. Gathje's Environmental Science as a recycling initiative project. Their goals include reducing waste in our school district and creating a behavioral change throughout the community. The board was in agreement that this is a good idea and gave the team the go ahead to get started. A complete copy of their report is attached.

Board Committees:

- Amy Jeffers/Community Education: commented that Valleyland has received certification through the Department of Human Services in order to serve families receiving child care assistance. More details are outlined in Luann Klevan's attached report.
- Jerry, Lanny & Scott/HVED: represented our district last week at a facilities study meeting. HVED serves 13
 districts and is considering building a facility for struggling students in those 13 districts. A recommendation was
 made to select a company by those in attendance.

Community Education/Luann Klevan: Her office move to the elementary has proven to be a good decision. She is more available to her staff by being in the same building. Class registration is now online. A complete copy of her report is attached.

COMMUNITY EDUCATION School Board Report 10/22/2018

Valleyland

- Certification through the Dept. of Human Services is now required in order to serve families
 receiving child care assistance (CCAP). Valleyland was approved for certification in September.
 The certification process requires specific training for staff, an improvement in our record
 keeping for dispensing medication and reporting injuries, and documentation regarding health
 and safety practices and procedures. In the future, a more intensive background check will also
 be required.
- Valleyland has made some adjustments for budget purposes. 1) No hot lunch served during the summer, 2) an increase in minimum hours, and 3) a slight increase in fees.
- The primary issue at this point is adequately staffing the program. We are in need of student and adult assistants for the after school shift.

Preschool

- Number increased this year. The 2-day 4 & 5 Year Old section returned. We do have openings in the 2-day classes for all ages.
- Teachers and staff are in the process of completing the fall assessments.

ECFE

• A new class was added – Thursdays, 4:15-5:45 p.m. Numbers are low at this time, but we hope the interest increases in order serve new families and to alleviate the large number in the Thursday evening class.

Youth Enrichment

- Interest in the October classes has been high.
- STEM classes or elementary students will begin in November. STEM opportunities will be available every month through April.
- Community Education is working with the Youth Enrichment League to bring Chess classes to Chatfield this winter & spring. The plan is also offer a Fencing camp this coming summer.

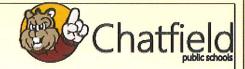

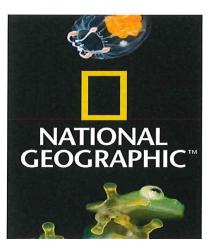
Congratulation to Nora Gathje

Chatfield Teacher Awarded Science Teacher of the Year

October 9, 2018

Nora Gathje a Chatfield High School science teacher has been announced as the recipient of the 2018 Secondary Science Teaching Award from the Minnesota Science Teachers Association (MnSTA). Nora was selected from a pool of applicants who are Minnesota science teachers for grades 7 through 12. The Minnesota Science Teachers Association also named Carrie Ehn of the School of Engineering and Arts in Golden Valley as the Elementary Science Teacher of the Year.

Nora teaches Advanced Placement Biology, Physical Science, Environmental Science, General Chemistry and College in the Schools (CIS) Chemistry. In addition, Nora is the coach of the "Rube Goldberg Team". The team has had multiple successes on the regional, state and national level for several years. Last year's team won the National Competition held in Chicago.

Retired Chemistry teacher Chuck Handlon who nominated Nora calls her "extremely dedicated and passionate for her students". One example he cited was Nora's willingness to go outside her "comfort zone" and attain an additional chemistry teaching license because of the need at Chatfield High School. "It's been enjoyable mentoring her in chemistry and seeing her grow professionally in her teaching skills motivated by a desire to always been the best teacher she can be in any subject."

The award will be presented to Nora Friday, November 9th at the Minnesota Conference on Science Education in St. Cloud. With the recognition comes a \$ 1,000 grant to Chatfield High School to be used in a classroom project designed by Nora as part of her application.

The MnSTA Science Teaching Award has been granted annually to one secondary and one elementary Minnesota science teacher since 1995. The MnSTA board has been committed to promoting and recognizing high quality public and private science education for over fifty years. www.mnsta.org

* Facility Outcomes *

Thank you all for attending and providing input. I think the conversation assisted in developing better understanding between stakeholders of what the needs and limitation are relating to facility use. Here is a simple list of outcomes. If you think I missed something or erred, please let me know right away.

Here is the order of priorities that will be followed when there is a conflict between facility requests.

- 1. School programs (In season)
- 2. CYSA/Out of season school programs
- 3. Regional teams that involve Chatfield students

On certain dates (below) the CYSA will be given blocks of time where facilities can be scheduled for use. This will be done on a seasonal basis (Facility Scheduling Seasons) according to the schedule below. Neither the CYSA nor regional teams can reserve facilities beyond the upcoming time period. The District will retain a percentage of available time for unexpected needs. Regional teams/associations may reserve a facility after the CYSA has submitted its initial request(s) for the upcoming season.

Facility Scheduling Seasons

*The date is by when the district should advise the CYSA of the available time blocks.

Fall I (August, September, October): July 15 Fall II (November, December): October 15 Winter I (January, February): December 15 Winter II (March, April, May): February 15

Also, it has been determined that there are morning practice times available at the elementary school which will be included in the available block information based on availability.

The Activities Director will resolve conflicts/disagreements that relate to facility requests. We will maintain open lines of communication on this and adjust as necessary.

Fund Raiser Outcomes

Thank you all for attending and providing input. I think the conversation was a good start in understanding what program needs are and what the role of fundraising currently is and what it should be going forward. This topic is quite complex. As such, I am going to try and break down questions and/or next steps by program and/or fundraiser type for our next meeting. Talking about everything all the time will not be productive. So, I am going to start with sports for the following reasons.

• As a group, they have the most visible and consistent history of traditional fundraisers (product/door to door) compared to other activities.

• They have district supported operating and/or capital budgets where many of the other programs may not.

Obviously, some sports have little or no traditional fundraisers, but I think it will be most manageable to group information by programs that are alike and start the inquiry process with one aspect of this topic. As we go along we will incorporate discussions about other programs when it makes sense or when we are ready for a new set of questions.

Football, Volleyball, Cross Country, B/G Basketball, Wrestling, Baseball, Softball, Track, Golf

- 1. Over a two year period, how much money does each sport typically raise and spend using fundraisers?
- 2. Over a two year period, what has each sport most often spent their fundraising money on?
- 3. Of those items identified in question #2, are there any that are critical to the basic operations of the program? In other words, are there things that the District should be paying for that it is not?
- 4. Of those items identified in question #2, are there any that parents of players could or should be asked to pay for?
- 5. What types of things should fundraising money be spent on? This should be more of collective discussion at the next meeting, but, I thought I would pose now to get you thinking.

Next Steps

- 1. I will work with Trista and the coaches on collecting information related to the questions above for our next meeting.
- 2. Develop a projected monthly calendar of all fundraisers for 18-19 and 19-20
- 3. I will set a date for our next meeting. Although, I may not be able to effectively do that until next week as I have a meeting with a surgeon this Friday (Oct 19) to hopefully reschedule my surgery. In other words, I don't want to set a date today only to find out that I can't be there as I will be out of commission for a number of days. And, it may take some time for the information to be collected and organized.
- 4. Develop discussion agenda for the next meeting.
