LWSD Music Education Opportunities at the Secondary Level:

A LWSD student's music education studies may include, but is not limited to, Intermediate, Proficient and Advanced levels of the traditional large ensembles - Bands, Choirs and String and Symphonic Orchestras. Students may also have the opportunity to study jazz ensemble, guitar, percussion ensemble, music theory, Advanced Placement (AP) Music Theory, technology, composition, song writing, piano lab/music keyboards, International Baccalaureate (IB) Music, music history, drum line, world and historical music, opera, musical theatre, world drumming.

LWSD traditional large ensembles and other instrumental, harmonizing instruments utilize standards for intermediate, proficient, and advanced levels. The music "classroom" consists of students who have a varying skill set due to the differences in the individual student's starting point in the music/instrument technique learning process. Teachers who recognize the differing students' starting point in the learning process can apply differing levels of standards within the same class. For example, the intermediate (or even novice) level standards of Harmonizing Instruments in the case of an 11th grade student who has just begun instruction, but use the advanced-level standards for a student in the same grade whose training and experience is more extensive
