### Department Review

Science Department

- Science department was given money for gizmos (exploringscience.com) and science legacy learning (making up labs). Approximately 120 students have shown up for science makeup labs- 7<sup>th</sup> graders have used the make up labs more than the other two grades.

Art Department

- Each teacher was able to go to a conference- brings fresh ideas and motivation
  - Derek's whole conference was paid for
  - All other Art Department teachers were had their conference fee's paid for and then paid for the rest out of pocket
- Money was used for bussing the choir students (120) to UVU junior high choir festival- this is the 9<sup>th</sup> year Legacy students have been able to attend the festival.
- Some money was used to purchase Chromebooks and a docking station- used for choir and band- student are able to get smart music (48 subscriptions) which was also paid for by trustlands

Legacy Learning

Brian Nash

- Total # of students who have used Legacy Learning (testing) this year: 630
- Average Visits per student: 2.7
- Math has the highest number of students using Legacy Learning
- A higher percentage of students are using Legacy Learning for testing instead of for tutoring.

- Question: Do we need two math teachers there in the afternoon?
- Math is 4 days of the week in the morning- usually waits until their individual teacher is assigned to Legacy Learning

#### Digital Citizenship

- More devices are needed to help prevent cell phone issues! Students struggle to self regulate when their own cell phones are allowed.
- Cloud books are slow and certain programs don't work well on the cloud books. No red ink might be able to replace UtahCompose. It's possible to purchase cloud books with a higher processing speed to help both the science and English departments, it is \$80 per device for extra processing speed. Science struggles with Raneer and needs flashplayer on their devices.
- Headphone and earbuds are an issue! Student's are using them during class time
- Students airdropping things to each other during class time
- Parents are texting kids during class!!
- Addressing technology addiction- students are having meltdowns when they are asked to surrender their phones
- Teachers need time to learn new programs and implement them within their curriculum
- More trainings on how to do the even the simple things that teachers already have access to
- Study hall NEEDS access to devices!
