

**REGULAR MEETING BOARD OF TRUSTEES
WISEBURN UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT**

May 25, 2017

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Trustees was called to order at 6:03 p.m. by Israel Mora, President, in the District Board Room. Call to Order

The Board entered closed session at 6:03 p.m. and reconvened at 7:00 p.m. There was no reportable action during Closed Session. Closed Session

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was led by Mrs. Terry Johnstone.

The Board spent 30 minutes recognizing the outstanding service of five Wiseburn employees. Peggy Kremer was recognized for 40 years of service at Cabrillo School, Mary Penna was recognized for 35 years of service at Cabrillo, Mark Walker was recognized for 35 years of service to the Maintenance Department, Terry Johnstone was recognized for 30 years of service at Anza School and Carrie Schat was recognized for 25 years of service at Dana and Burnett Schools. Katie Miliias (Burnett) and Kristy Sullivan (Anza) were also recognized for 25 years of service but were unable to attend the Board meeting. The principals of Anza, Burnett and Cabrillo and the Maintenance Manager, Bill Denney, expressed kind words about the contributions of each of these employees. Special Presentation

The Board expressed their appreciation for the dedication and loyalty of these employees and noted that the stability and longevity of these employees are a key contributing factor to the success of our schools.

A fifteen-minute recess was taken to celebrate the accomplishments of these individuals. Recess

Dr. Goldman shared that the retirements of Cabrillo Principal, Margaret Lynch, and Burnett Principal, Laura Sullivan, are a great loss to the District and both individuals will be very hard to replace. From the Board

Dr. Goldman shared that he had attended the State of the City Luncheon for El Segundo and he continues to be very impressed with our very positive connection with the City.

Dr. Goldman also shared that he had attended the Cabrillo Open House and the energy and joy and enthusiasm was evident throughout the campus.

In closing, he shared that the two adjectives that best describe Laura Sullivan and Margaret Lynch are love and joy.

Each of the Board members followed with very warm and positive comments on the outstanding contributions over the last 9 years that both Margaret Lynch and Laura Sullivan

have made to the District. In turn, both Laura and Margaret thanked the Board for all of their support and leadership in making Wiseburn the wonderful place it is to live and work. From the Board (Cont'd.)

Mr. Bañuelos shared that the Herndon team of five students including his son Benny, earned a 2nd Place silver medal in the annual Herndon Competition. The project that they were working on was the efficiency of solar cells and steps that engineers can take to make solar cells more efficient.

Ms. Kaneda shared that she had been following legislation that will remove the Budget Reserve Cap for small school districts. While this legislation doesn't impact larger school districts, it will certainly have an impact on the 600+ small school districts in the State of California.

Both Dr. Goldman and Mr. Mora expressed how impressed they are with the Financial Education that is provided to students at Da Vinci Science. The course entitled "Economics of College" is very effective in teaching the consequences of incurring a large amount of debt in acquiring a college education. The class also focused on credit card debt.

Mr. Wilson gave the Board an update on the May Revise and a quick overview of the budget situation that will include a 1.56% COLA, an addition of 1.4 billion to Prop 98; however, there are major increases to the District's contribution to both PERS and STRS retirement systems. And one-time revenues from the State will not be paid out in 2017-18, and in the Governor's Budget would be delayed until 2019. As the Governor has pointed out, this is one of the longest economic recoveries in the history of the State and he still preaches that recession is just around the corner. From the Chief Business Official

Dr. Jones provided the Board with a CALPADS update. Gloria White and Dr. Jones have been reviewing all of the CALPADS information to make sure that it is correct. Our entire accountability system is based on the CALPADS data so correct information is essential. He also shared that the School Mint online registration is going much smoother this year. From the Deputy Superintendent

Dr. Johnstone shared that he had attended Lobby Day in Sacramento meeting with legislators and focusing on the budget, the Reserve Cap, pension impacts, teacher shortage and credentialing flexibility. While in Sacramento, Dr. Johnstone also met with representatives from both PERS and STRS. From the Superintendent

Dr. Johnstone shared again how impressive the Up and Up performance was at Peter Burnett School. The Instagram page that was created by the rock band, Coldplay, received over 201,000 "likes".

In closing, Dr. Johnstone shared that he and Alicia Galindo had attended the Change of Command Ceremony at Fort MacArthur to celebrate the Change of Command from Lieutenant General Samuel Greaves to Lieutenant General John F. Thompson. Dr. Johnstone commented that he had never been with so many 2-, 3- and 4-Star Generals. The Air Force Base is a huge asset to the El Segundo community and economy and is a wonderful neighbor of our District and most especially our new Wiseburn High School campus directly across the street from the Air Force Base.
