










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2019 Constitution Bowl

Who: 5th and 6th Grades

What: A FUN tournament where children are put into teams of four to six students. Each team competes against teams from other schools. Counselor's Corner

We are focusing on Habit 5 "Seek to Understand, then to be Understood." One important part of this skill is to be an active listener. Sometimes we have BLOCKERS that interfere with our listening. Here are the blockers we talked about in my lesson this month:

- 1. Daydreaming imagining other things and not being in the present moment
- 2. Filtering only hearing what you want to hear
- 3. Rehearsing thinking of what you want to say, while the other person is speaking
- 4. Judging making observations about the speakers clothes, personality, tone, body language
- 5. Distractions hunger, tiredness, noise, others talking, music, electronics

Be careful of these common blockers we all struggle with, when you notice you are doing one... name it and STOP it, and then get back on track to active listening. ①



Oak Hills Read-a-thon!




February 22nd through March 1st

- Flashlight Friday (have fun reading w/ your flashlight at school)






