

Erin's Law

What Is Erin's Law? In 2015, the Oregon legislature passed SB 856, also known as Erin's Law. Erin's Law requires the development and adoption of child sexual abuse prevention programs for students in kindergarten through 12th grade in all Oregon public schools. SB 856 mandates that all Oregon Public Schools provide:

- A minimum of 4 instructional sessions (equal to or greater than a standard class period) of sex abuse prevention instruction per year for grades kindergarten through 12.
- Sexual abuse instruction that is integrated and part of required district comprehensive sexuality education plan and is aligned

with state standards.

- Instruction that is age appropriate, medically accurate, and is not shame or fear based.
- Instruction that is culturally inclusive and is responsive to diverse students including race, ethnicity, gender identity and sexual orientation.

Aloha High School will begin implementing the 4 Erin's Law lessons during Access Tutorial starting in March. Skills addressed in the lessons include techniques to recognize sexual abuse, effective communication skills to establish boundaries, and skills to tell a trusted adult.

In all areas, parents and guardians are a child's first and most influential teachers. Parents, guardians and schools share a common goal: we want students of all ages to be valued, respected, and safe in all aspects of their lives. 



Warriors are First Oregon Cheer Team to Win Nationals

With a big win in the Game Day competition, our Warriors made Oregon history by being the state's first team to win the Cheer-leading Championship in Orlando, Florida. Coach Brittne Johnson says, "I

Annual Asbestos Notification

In 1986, Congress passed the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA). This law required all K-12 schools to be inspected for asbestos-containing building materials (ACBM).

These inspections were completed and the plan for all ACBM management was filed with the State of Oregon's Department of Education on October 11, 1988. A copy of this management plan for each school is on file in the main office of each respective school and in the Archive Room at the District's Maintenance Services Department.

Users of District buildings, both children and adults, have not and will not be exposed to any level of free and harmful asbestos. Covering, enclosing, or encapsulation ACBM has provided the necessary protection from any possible hazards.
