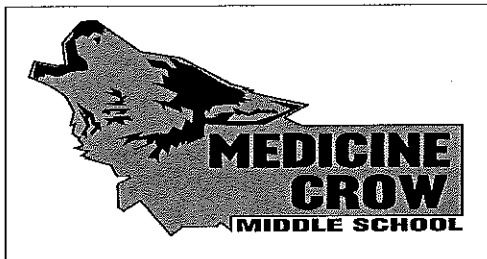

Dear Students & Parents:

Hello Wolfpack Family!

While the winter slips its way to spring, life at MCMS has kept a steady pace! We will all, however, be ready for spring weather and sunshine!

Heading into early spring is the start of the testing season for our students. We will already have a group of 8th graders take the NAEP test March 5, which is administered to a random selection of 8th graders. The 8th graders as a whole will also take the MontCAS Science test on March 13. MAP testing will be 6th-8th grade in math, reading and language April 9-16. And finally, 6th - 8th grade will take the Smarter Balanced test in math and reading the week of May 6-10. You can help students have a successful testing experience by following a few simple guidelines.

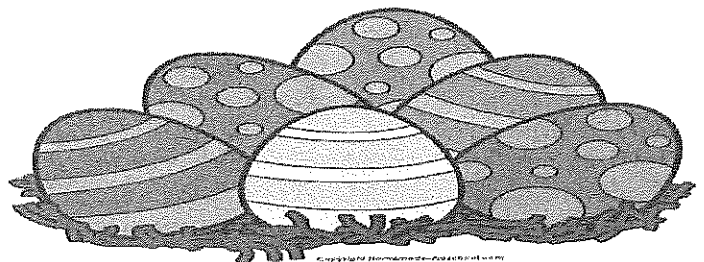
1. Assure your student attends school on test days, arriving with plenty of time to make first period without a rush.
2. Make sure your student gets a good night sleep the night before a test.
3. Breakfast is indeed the most important meal of the day, especially during testing! Please remind your child to eat breakfast on test days.
4. Reinforce with your child to do his or her best on the test.
5. If your child has test anxiety, remain positive. Staying calm will help your child stay calm. The test is just a snapshot of what they know. They have been working hard all year and the test is a check in to see how they are progressing.

POWER HOUR - As the year progresses, we have found that POWER HOUR has been successful in helping students get assignments completed. When a student is missing 5-7 assignments, the teacher will send the assignments up to the office. The students then attend POWER HOUR during their lunch and advisory times to get the assignments completed. If a student is missing 8 or more assignments, the student will stay after school. Please support this program at home by following up on any missing assignments, making sure that they get completed. If you have not set up PowerSchool access to view student grades/attendance, please stop by and we will help set up your account. This access shows you your child's grades in the gradebook and any missing work!

CUP FUNDRAISER - Thank you for supporting our school fundraiser by purchasing from the cup fundraiser. We profited \$2500 which will go towards the purchase of more playground equipment for after lunch recess and other end of year activities for students.

Please bring your photo ID with you when picking up your children during the school day. If you have any questions or concerns, please call us at (406)281-8600.

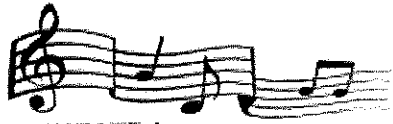
6th GRADE PARENTS

The State of Montana has immunization requirements for all students entering the 7th Grade. All 7th Graders must have 2 MMR shots and Varicella immunizations and a TD booster immunization. If you are not sure if your child has received the 2nd dose of MMR or Varicella, please feel free to call the office. If you have proof of the TDap booster, please bring the record to the office and we will make a copy for our records.

Immunizations are given at Riverstone Health Immunization Clinic at 123 S. 27th Street, Mondays and Fridays from 1:00 pm-4:30 pm and on Wednesdays from 11:00 am-6:30 pm or you can make an appointment with their doctor. We are also fortunate to have the convenience of having the Riverstone Clinic at Medicine Crow. Please call 247-3210 to make an appointment.

Please bring student's immunization card to the school for verification after getting their shots. Thank you for your assistance.

CASA VOLUNTEERS

The success of our future depends on the well-being of our children, but in Montana they are among the most vulnerable in our communities. Statewide, the number of children entering foster care due to abuse or neglect in recent years has skyrocketed. In Yellowstone County, the number of children removed from their home has increased drastically from 182 in 2014 to nearly 600 in 2017, resulting in approximately 1,000 children currently in Foster Care. Despite the enormity of these statistics, our children are more than numbers, and each one deserves a voice. You could be that voice by becoming a volunteer Court Appointed Special Advocate, with CASA of Yellowstone County. DRIVERS EDUCATION: SUMMER 2019

REGISTRATION FOR BOTH SESSIONS IS APRIL 1, 2019 - APRIL 12, 2019

SESSION 1: Students must be born on or before November 20, 2004

When: May 20, 21, 23, & 28 and June 3–28, 2019

Where: Senior, Skyview, or West High School

Time: 8:00 am or 10:00 am at the high schools. On May 20, 21, 23, 28 and June 3, 4, & 5 classes will meet at 4:00 pm at the high schools. On May 20, 21, 23 & 28, 8th grade students will be bussed from Billings Public Schools Middle Schools to the high schools on those dates. Transportation after class and in June is the responsibility of the student/parent.

Fee: \$265.00 must be paid by April 30, 2019

SESSION 2: Students must be born on or before January 8, 2005

When: July 8 – August 8, 2019

Where: Senior, Skyview and West – 1 class at each school capped at the first 30 students to register

Time: 10:00am

Fee: \$265.00 must be paid by April 30, 2019

All classes will meet for 2 hours each day Monday-Friday in June. The first session dates in May will meet after school from 4:00 pm – 6:00 pm. 8th graders at Ben Steele, Castle Rock, Lewis & Clark, Medicine Crow, Riverside and Will James will be bussed from their middle school to the high school for class. Students who attend schools outside of Billings Public Schools are responsible for their own transportation to the high schools for the May classes. There are 6 drive times outside of class time during the course. These are scheduled by the instructor. Students are allowed up to 3 absences but those absences must be made up at a time scheduled by the instructor. **Anyone missing more than 3 days or failing to attend the make-up days will automatically fail the course. NO EXCEPTIONS!**

Students must be enrolled in grades 9-12 for the 2019-2020 school year.

No refunds will be issued so please make sure Drivers Ed fits your schedule and that you won't have more than 3 absences before registering and paying for it! Please do not pay for the 2nd session until you have been notified that you have been accepted in the class.

RIVERSTONE HEALTH CLINIC

Riverstone Health has officially opened their school based health clinic at Medicine Crow. They are located next to the Boys and Girls Club entrance/office. Please note the clinic is for SD2 families only and is not open as a clinic to the general public. We hope this partnership is a benefit to our students and their families as they take care of their health needs. Appointments are available daily from 1:00-5:00pm and they provide many services.

- Sports Physicals (schedule anytime in the month of May) There will be days in June or July as well, please watch for the dates! Appointments will start up again the week before school is in session in August.
- Well-child exams with immunizations
- Counseling and child psychiatry (behavioral/mental health)
- Sore throats, earaches, colds, fevers, stomach aches
- Asthma and diabetes
- Limited lab tests
- Referrals to community resources
- Assistance with health insurance options

Riverstone provides medical care to the whole family, including the adults, brothers and sisters- "Healthy Parents, Healthy Kids". Even if you have a regular doctor, once you enroll in the school clinic, your child can be seen if they have an earache, sore throat, cold or flu symptoms during the school day. CAREER CRUISING

Career Cruising.....Oh the places you might go!

We know - we know - you have not even survived 8th grade and moved on to having a student driver and we are starting to explore career and options for life after high school!!! Career Cruising for students is a web-based self-exploration and planning program that includes skill and career assessments, 4-year planning tools, post-secondary school and job market information, exploration activities, an employment guide, and more. The My Plan digital portfolio allows students to document each stage of their career exploration process, think critically about their options, and build an individualized future readiness plan. Basically, starting in 6th grade and continuing through high school, students will access Career Cruising to begin looking at their future. The journey starts with interest inventories and strength assessment to guide students into a career path to begin to explore. They have the opportunity to research jobs; discover areas of interest they may never knew existed; and explore what education/internships/journeyman programs, etc. can be completed to access a desired career path. This is something students complete during Advisory. So, when you get the chance, ask your student about Career Cruising and the ideas discovered through the program. Your child can take you in to see this program (at home) through their powerschool account on a computer. It is never too early to start talking about the future!
