

Kindness Week is Coming! There will be 'Random Activities of Kindness' each day...

MONDAY: Kindness Week Begins - The student council will launch a new program called "Student Shout-Outs" which are similar to Blue Slips / Wrangler Awards except STUDENTS give them out! Children will be able to complete a Shout-Out form for any other person in the school - either another student, a teacher or staff member, or a volunteer. The students will have their first opportunity to nominate someone for a Shout-Out on Monday during lunch. Afterwards, a stack of shout-outs will be available outside the office on top of the Box Tops drawers alongside the Shout-Out Mailbox. When students have completed their Shout-Out form they should place it in the mailbox for special delivery. Student Council members will collect the forms and put one copy in the teacher's mailbox while the other copy will be stapled to the Shout-Out Board located outside the lunchroom. TUESDAY: Wear Yellow! Be a star and radiate kindness - Student Council will be helping the student body make a Kindness Chain. There will be slips of paper where students can either write an act of kindness done for them or by them for another person. We will link the slips together to make a chain and see how long we can make it during the week. Extra links in be made available in teacher's mailboxes. When the slips have been filled out, students can put them in the shout-out mailbox to be added to the chain. WEDNESDAY: Wear Something Sporty! Cheer on your favorite team AND include everyone in kindness - We have invited the Impact Team from Viewmont to play some cooperative outdoor games during lunch recess. Student Council will help by inviting all students to participate and being a good example of sportsmanship. THURSDAY: Wear Wrangler Gear! Wear your school shirt and round up a new friend - Student Council members will be handing out a treat to students as they leave the lunchroom. Many students have asked if free items are available in the School Store, so we thought it would be a kind thing to give every student something this week – just because! FRIDAY: Wear Funky Socks! Be crazy for kindness - Students will have the opportunity to create a bookmark for a friend during lunch recess.

THREE THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT UTAH'S THREE MOST RECENT GOVERNORS...

GARY HERBERT – served for six years as a Staff Sergeant in the Utah Army National Guard, was a real estate agent before becoming a politician, was elected as a Utah County commissioner and Lieutenant Governor before becoming Utah's Governor JON HUNTSMAN, JR. – served in every presidential administration since Ronald Reagan, became Governor of Utah in 2005 and resigned in 2009 to become US Ambassador to China under President Obama, currently serving as Ambassador to Russia OLENE WALKER – served as Lt. Governor of Utah for 10 years under Mike Leavitt, was passionate about education and earned a Master's Degree in Education Administration from the U of U, was sworn into office just a few days before her 73rd birthday
