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Laurence Fund

Enriching

Like all independent schools, Laurence relies on annual contributions to the Laurence Fund from trustees, parents, grandparents, alumni families, faculty, and staff. These funds help support the important enhancements to our academic and enrichment programs that keep Laurence's curriculum on the cutting-edge of elementary education.

Each family is encouraged to participate in a way that is personally meaningful. A gift of any size to the Laurence Fund is greatly appreciated and truly makes a difference. We strive for 100% participation from families, and even our faculty and staff – united as a community, we all enrich the educational experience of Laurence students. Gifts to the Laurence Fund are tax-deductible and directly support the daily operations of the school, including:

The Laurence Fund is launched in October of each school year and runs through the end of spring semester. Families may make a pledge to the Laurence Fund at any time during the school year and pay it between the date of the pledge and June 30th.

Matching Gifts

Corporate matching gifts provide a wonderful opportunity to double, sometimes even triple, your contribution to Laurence. Check with your employer to see if your company will match your contribution.

Capital Campaigns

Most independent schools conduct capital campaigns periodically in order to meet major campus needs such as new construction and large-scale renovations. At Laurence, capital campaigns have allowed us to grow our facilities and keep them state-of-the-art. These projects are generally too costly to be supported by tuition dollars and annual fund contributions. Such campaigns can also include an endowment component designed to support programs and facilities long into the future. Gifts to capital campaigns are generally much larger than annual fund contributions and are payable over three to five years.

Endowment Funds

Endowment funds are typically held in long-term investments with the principal remaining untouched, creating a permanent source of revenue and providing both immediate funding and long-term financial security to a school. An endowment fund is structured to grow over time through reinvestment. Gifts to this type of fund are impactful in the short-term and allow for exponential future growth.

The Jacobson Legacy Scholarship Endowment

At Laurence, we believe that having a socioeconomically diverse student body is important and beneficial to our School community. To that end, we currently provide full and partial financial support to numerous families out of our operating budget. However, our founders, Lynn and Marvin Jacobson, desired to guarantee the future of financial aid at Laurence. In 2013, we established the Jacobson Legacy Scholarship Endowment to ensure that a Laurence education would always be available for a wide range of families. We are in the building phase of this fund and working toward making it selfsupporting.

Ways of Giving

The following are ways that donors may give to Laurence School. In all cases, when discussing the tax implications of a gift, you are encouraged to consult with your tax advisors.

Cash. Outright cash donations can be made via check or credit card (Visa, MasterCard or American Express).

Pledges. Pledges to the Laurence Fund (the School's annual fund) must be completed by June 30 of each year. Pledges to capital campaigns may be spread over three to five years.

Stocks and Securities. There can be significant tax advantages to donating appreciated stock, rather than cash, to a charity. Most donors can deduct the full fair market value of the appreciated stock without paying capital gains tax.
