WHEREAS, the Board of Education believes that it would be in the best interest of the School District to participate in cooperative purchasing through National IPA; and

WHEREAS, National IPA and its Lead Public Agencies comply substantially with the competitive bidding requirements of New York State General Municipal Law Section 103 in such cooperative bids:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the Harrison Central School District hereby authorizes the School District's participation in such cooperative purchasing through National IPA, and authorizes the Superintendent of Schools to execute a Participating Membership Agreement with National IPA, subject to the following conditions: (1) National IPA and its Lead Public Agencies shall perform all purchases and procurements substantially in accordance with the competitive bidding requirements of Section 103 of the new York State General Municipal Law; (2) Any such bid/RFP shall specifically state that such bid/RFP is open to and can be used by other governmental units; (3) the School District is not obligated to purchase any goods or services; (4) the School District can choose which goods and services to purchase, if any, based upon the list of items bid, including the specifications for each good and service; and (5) participation in this cooperative purchasing contract shall not require the payment of any fees.
