# A Message from President Dr. Lynne Saccaro

Dear Friends of Resurrection,

The halls are filled with the chatter, excitement and laughter that only teenage girls can bring to a school... the 2012-13 year has begun! We have also welcomed the largest 9th grade class in three years and the many transfer students who have joined us from both public and other area Catholic high schools.

As you have personally experienced, Resurrection is a magnificent place to be. Our students and their families join a proud and longstanding tradition of high quality Catholic education. They also join a learning community that daily commits itself to nurturing the unique, God-given gifts of each of our young women as they discover, participate, succeed and serve during their four years with us.

The 2012 Olympics in London were designated the Year of the Woman. This year, there were more female than male athletes participating in the Olympics. In addition, each of the 205 countries participating, including those most lacking in rights for women--Saudi Arabia, Brunei and Qatar--had female representation...the first time in Olympic history. The year 2012 also marks the 40th anniversary of Title IX, the federal law that opened opportunities and equality for women in education and athletics. Long before Title IX, single gender Catholic schools for girls have historically led the way in providing opportunities for their students by participation in Amateur Athletic Union (AAU) tournaments before the Girls Catholic Athletic Conference (GCAC) and Illinois High School Association (IHSA) were formed. Our current female athletes have a difficult time grasping the concept and the logic behind a six person basketball team where only some players were allowed to cross the center line during the game. That concept makes for great conversation!

This year we are expanding our presence on social media to further our avenues of communication. Knowing through strong evidence that people simply do not always have time to read all that is written, we hope that you'll "like" us as we expand our presence on Facebook and Twitter.

In this issue of the Resonance, you'll see the many opportunities and events planned for the 2012-2013 school year. It is our sincere hope that you will join us in person or in spirit. We thank you for your continued support of our young women and for the prayers that are offered for the continued success of Resurrection. The vitality and joyful spirit that define Resurrection continues for the good of our young women!

Resurrection College Prep High School celebrated the 2011-12 school year with events and activities to mark the school's 90th year of educating young women. As the year concludes, we look back at our school's history and development.

1891 - the Congregation of the Sisters of the Resurrection is founded in Rome by widow Celine Borzecka and her daughter Hedwig

1900 - the Sisters of the Resurrection began their ministry in the United States when four Sisters came to Chicago and immediately began teaching at St. Mary of the Angels Parish. They soon opened many other schools around Chicago and in several states.

1912 - Sister Anne Strzelecka, C.R. purchased over 42 acres of land in northwest Chicago on Old Tanner Road, now Talcott Avenue.

1914 - a convent and school were built, and the following year Sister Anne opened Resurrection Academy, an elementary school for boys and girls and a boarding school for girls. Boys attendance was discontinued in 1922 when the high school was opened. Resurrection Academy continued as an all-girls elementary school until 1961.

1920 - Sister Anne bought the 52-acre Anderson onion farm and skating pond where Resurrection Medical Center now stands.

1922 - Resurrection High School opened in what is now the Sisters' Provincial Home. Four years later, the first graduating class consisted of four young women, one of whom went on to become a successful attorney, as well as a mother and grandmother of future Resurrection graduates.

1926 - a wing was added to the original Academy building for the high school department and the high school expanded. In 1929 a larger L-shaped addition was added to the Academy building.

1947 to 1961 - after World War II the population on Chicago's far northwest side increased rapidly, causing a dramatic increase in enrollment. In 1954, to help further relieve some of the capacity issues, the boarding program ended and plans to build a gymnasium began in 1955. In determining the location of the gymnasium, the decision to build an entirely new high school facility on the corner of

Talcott and Oriole avenues was proposed and accepted. In 1961 the elementary department was phased out, since by that time there were sufficient parish schools in the area to accommodate the children

1962 - a new, much larger school building opened at 7500 West Talcott Aveune. The curriculum continued to expand over the following decades as Resurrection began moving towards the strong college-preparatory curriculum that it provides today.

1997 - an \$11-million construction program added two state-of-the-art science labs, two computer labs, a technology center with Internet capabilities, a 36-station fitness center, as well as air conditioning throughout the facility. Administrative space, which was scattered throughout the building, was centralized in an expanded administrative center, freeing up space for other educational uses such as a writing center and a student services center.

2008 - the Little Theatre underwent a \$2-million renovation. The 500 seat auditorium, built in 1964, is the school's central venue for the performing arts.

2008/09 - The daily schedule was re-evaluated and changed to a modified A/B block schedule. Classes meet every other day for an extended period of time.

2009 - the school library was transformed into a library/media center and the school bookstore, the Fine Arts wing and the Social Room, next to the chapel, were also updated.

2011/12 – Resurrection College Prep High School celebrates 90 years of educating young women. Resurrection is the largest all-girls Catholic, Christian college preparatory high school on the north side of Chicago. Since its founding in 1922, Resurrection has graduated over 13,500 alumnae.

#### Class of 2012 Celebrates Graduation

One hundred and ninety-five young women celebrated their graduation as the Resurrection College Prep High School Class of 2012. A Baccalaureate Mass was held on Monday, May 21, 2012 at St. John Brebeuf in Niles and the graduation ceremony was held on Wednesday, May 23, 2012 at the Copernicus Center in Chicago.

At the Resurrection Baccalaureate Mass thirty-four graduating seniors presented their mothers or grandmothers with roses. These special mothers and grandmothers were Resurrection alumnae who were honored for continuing the Resurrection legacy with the current generation of students.

The Resurrection Class of 2012 included seventeen Illinois State Scholars and the 195 graduates were awarded over \$7.6 million in college scholarships. At the May 23, 2012 graduation ceremony at the Copernicus

Center three students were selected to address their classmates. The graduates included young women who have distinguished themselves in academics, service, athletics and artistic achievements.

Two high achieving students **Donna Gawron '12** and **Briana Torres '12** presented "Student Reflections" at the graduation ceremony. The Commencement speaker, chosen from the Class of 2012 graduates, was **Bianca Baltazar '12**.

Donna Gawron '12, President of the Resurrection Student Council, was the first student speaker. She read from the Dr. Suess book, "Oh, the Places You'll Go" and urged her classmates to hold onto their imaginations as they face the next phase of their lives. She also challenged the Class of 2012 to live out the words in the song "Go Make a Difference" which is sung frequently at Resurrection liturgies.

Donna Gawron was a Res Scholar and an Illinois State Scholar, a member of the National Honor Society, the Spanish Honor Society and Tri-M, the Music Honor Society. She was President of the Resurrection Science Club and a member of the Resurrection Chamber Orchestra. She also performs in a Polish violin and dance ensemble. Donna Gawron will be attending Loyola University in Chicago where she plans to study biology as a pre-med student.

Briana Torres '12, the second student speaker, was an active member of Key Club, Italian Club and National Honor Society during her time at Resurrection. "I personally have come to appreciate that each one of us graduates are one of a kind individuals with the potential to make a lasting impact in this world," she said. Briana Torres was a Res Scholar and Illinois State Scholar and will continue her education at Boston University, where she plans to study International Relations and Arabic.

Bianca Baltazar '12 was selected as the Commencement speaker. She was a member of the Orchesis Dance team, was involved in various clubs at Resurrection, volunteered at Resurrection Medical Center and served as the sophomore class Secretary. "With the foundation Resurrection College Prep High School has given us, we are prepared to face our future. High school has been a time of learning and maturing; now it is our time to triumph." Bianca Baltazar will be attending Marquette University, where she plans to major in Broadcast Journalism while pursuing Political Science as a minor.

# Inaugural Run for Res 5K





#### Still **Res**onating after all these years...

Resurrection High School was never just an all-girls Catholic educational institution on Talcott Avenue that I attended and graduated from in the 1960's. Resurrection was an experience which impacted my mind and touched my heart and soul. My Resurrection experience has been a source of inspirational thoughts, words and deeds and the memories continue to evolve over time

It wasn't the walls, the desks or blackboards, the cafeteria, the gym, the Little Theatre or the main office that inspired us fledgling females in uniform skirts. It wasn't even the highly polished insignia on the floor of the front entrance. It was the passionate, faith-filled and joyful presence of the Sisters of the Resurrection and dedicated lay teachers that inspired us.

It was the turbulent 60's and the rock and roll music and cultural changes stimulated rebellion in us. In retrospect, the sometimes gruff exterior of our teachers was understandable as we rolled-up our skirts a little higher, teased our hair a little wider, and applied make-up, which got a little heavier after school, of course.

Competing with the era's distractions was notably one of the most influential sisters at the time, Sister Lydia Mary. She was the Godfearing, sophisticated, intellectually astute, articulate principal during my attendance from 1961-1965. I remember Sister Lydia Mary standing before the student body in the gym, especially at student council assemblies, not just setting the tone or making announcements, but taking the opportunity to purposely guide and inspire. Through tone, stance and demeanor, Sister Lydia Mary delivered the most important message: that we students had the

potential to be intelligent, able, holy young ladies, worthy of setting high standards and achieving them.

When Sister Lydia Mary spoke, the many that listened walked to class a little taller, a little prouder, more hopeful and more positive. She instilled in us the knowledge that, above all else, we were the beloved children of God, the image and likeness of His creation. This definition of character and our worth came through in the manner we were addressed and the way we were treated at Resurrection High School.

As I recall my student - teacher relationships, I have memories of many of my dear teachers including Sister M. Jerome, Sister Frances Therese, Sister Stephanie, Sister Charles Louise and Sister Grace Marie. I fondly remember Mrs. Kelly (formerly Ms. Wasilewski), Ms. Rog, Ms. Vallo, Sister Simplicia, Sister Eymard and Sister Consolata. Many of my former teachers have passed from this world, but they continue to come joyfully and reverently to my mind. I also cherish the friendships that I made with other Resites. The girls that I knew in high school have grown in grace and wisdom to this very day. And acquaintances who I looked to with warmth or admiration all added to my classroom experience.

Small wonder then, that during particular seasons of the year, I recall certain Resurrection traditions or rituals. This year, something urged me to return to my alma mater for the annual May Crowning ceremony. My cousin, Karen Oster Dahlgren '72 accompanied me and we were both so happy that we attended. Although seniors in cap and gown no longer lead a procession to the grotto, the uniformed students gave spirited homage to the Mother of God in the gym by singing "Hail Holy Queen"

Enthroned Above" to the upbeat rhythm sung in the film *Sister Act*. After the May Crowning, we had the opportunity to visit with Sister Lydia Mary and some other wonderful Sisters.

Sister Lydia Mary celebrated her 99th birthday in July and she is facing challenges from Alzheimer's disease. Primarily through eye contact and the familiar look on her face, reminiscent from the past, I felt sure that Sister Lydia Mary and I connected once again. She read from a card I gave her written to convey the highlights of my tribute to her and I believe that she understood what I was trying to say. With humility she accepted the praise and thanksgiving with joy and elation. I was moved by the look in her eyes and the soft smile on her face.

Although the year is 2012 and Sister Lydia Mary and I have definitely grown older, I realized, once again, that some things will never change if they are the truth predicated by love. *Caretas et Veritas!* Charity and Truth!
