



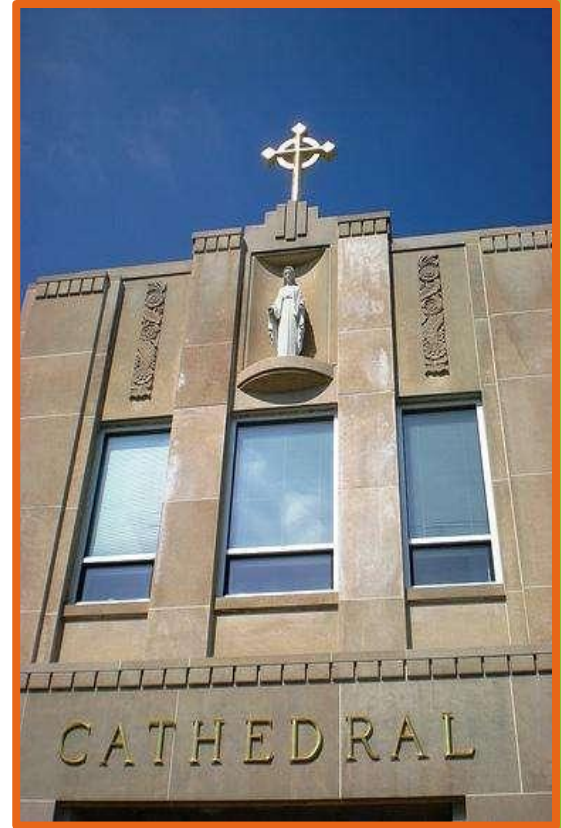

Cathedral Graduation Requirements

- **10 credits of English:**
 - 8 credit of Eng 9/10/11/12 + 1 credit Composition + 1 credit Debate/Speech
- **8 credits of Math**
- **6 credits of Science:**
 - 2 credits Biology + 2 credits Chemistry/Physics + 2 credits science electives
- **6 credits of Social Studies:**
 - 2 credits World History + 2 credits US History + 1 credit Government + 1 credit Economics
- **3 credits of Physical Education:**
 - 1 credit General P.E. + 1 credit elective P.E. + 1 credit Health
- **4 credits of World Language** (*Must be 2 consecutive years of one language)
- **2 credits of Fine Arts** (Music/Choir courses, Theatre courses, & Visual Arts)
- **3 credits of Elective course** (your choice!)
- **Service Hours** (all 4 years)

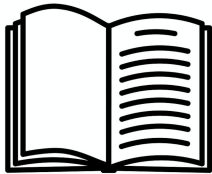
IN's Graduation Pathways


