More than just an honor roll, NHS serves to recognize those students who have demonstrated excellence in the areas of scholarship, service, leadership, and character. Stevenson's National Honor Society chapter activities include fundraising, charitable activities, and service to the school and community.

 - (b) The role required the student to facilitate effective communication between individuals and/or groups.
 - (c) The role required the student and his/her group to set a goal and create an action plan to achieve it.
- 2) Completion of 1-3 leadership experiences with adult verification that meet the following criteria:
 - (a) Service activities are done on behalf of others (not including immediate family members).
 - (b) No compensation: grade, class credit, monetary or other has been given.
 - (c) Service activities must be done outside the school day or during unscheduled time.
 - (d) The primary intent of the activity is to aid and assist others for the good of the community.
- 3) Successful evaluation of the student's character through an analysis of the student's disciplinary record.

The Theatre Department offers students the opportunity to apply and hone the acting, technical, and ensemble skills they learn in their theatre classes in five co-curricular productions each year beginning in August and running through April. Students must audition for acting roles and apply for production staff as well as technical leadership roles. However, after some basic safety training, all students are welcome to participate in entry-level technical crew roles including: set, lighting, sound, costume/makeup, and running crews.

COMMITMENT

All cast members are required to work on crew and attend set strike. Students must make sure they are fully available to attend rehearsals with few exceptions, and be fully available during the technical rehearsals weeks of productions.

We meet in various locations: Studio Theatre, Little Theatre, PAC, and West Auditorium.

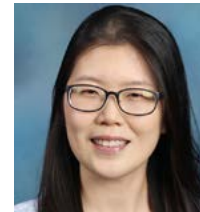

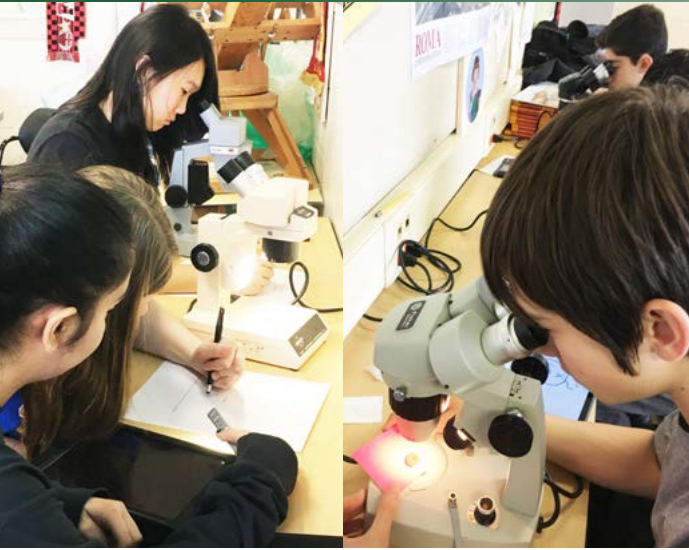
