Math

Curriculum: Saxon and supplementary resources

Typical Level: Math 5/4
Advanced Levels: Math 6/5 or Math 7/6

Science

Curriculum: Lab-based Science Program

Content: Birds, sound lab, owl pellet lab, astronomy (moon phases, constellations), water cycle, ocean, ecosystems, circulatory system

Content: Explorers, American colonial life, French and Indian War, American Revolution, Civil War, Age of Progress, World Wars I and II

Content: Research writing, creative writing, poetry writing, historical fiction, editing and publishing
