Employee of the Month: Ms. Pastor recognized Dr. Baker-Herring as the Employee of the month and shared some of Dr. Baker-Herrings achievements. She has been instrumental in saving the district money by resurrecting the online program, Atlas. This 23a and online program currently has 18 Anderson students fully online, four Asher students and 34 students enrolled in the 23a program. Many of these students were counted in the Fall FTE. The 23a students are counted monthly. We receive state funding for these students. With our previous contract we were paying a company \$500, or what we received per student. That money now stays in Southgate. Ms. Pastor is excited that our students now have the opportunity to explore online learning with Southgate Schools. We want our students to be successful in these classes and eventually graduate, Dr. Baker-Herring has included many supports to help keep the students on track. Along with starting this program, Dr. Baker-Herring is in charge of K-12 Curriculum, State and Federal Programs, kindergarten registration, EL WIDA, WEA Professional Development, Sex Education and 6 through 12 MTSS just to name a few. Ms. Pastor is proud to call Dr. Baker-Herring a colleague and a friend and congratulated her.

#### ACTION

- 1. Overnight & Out-of-State Trip Request for the Winter Guard Program: Ms. Pastor explained the request is for the Winter Guard to attend the Winter Guard International World Championships in Dayton Ohio from Tuesday, April 2, 2019 through Sunday, April 7, 2019. This is during our spring recess and the students will not be missing any school.
- 2018/19-95 It was moved by Dr. Pomponio supported by Mr. Green, the board approve the April 2019 Overnight and Out-of-State trip request for the Winter Guard to attend the Winter Guard International World Championships in Dayton, Ohio.

2. New CTE Course Adoption for Machine Trades & Engineering: Ms. Pastor explained that the board was being asked to approve a new Career-Technical Education course, Machine Trades & Engineering. Mr. John Nasarzewski, Director of the Downriver Career Technical Consortium is here to speak briefly about this opportunity.

Mr. Nasarzewski and Ms. Lanto, Business Operations Manager for Trenton Forging Co. addressed the board. Ms. Lanto stated her company is a local manufacturing company that does forging, machining and quite a bit of engineering and they are very interested in this program getting up and running because of their personal experience trying to find skilled trades men and women to fill the positions her company continually has open.

Mr. Nazarzewski added it is this shortfall of skilled trades that is driving new programs more aggressively. This program is similar to the Mechatronics Program that was set up approximately four years ago. One of our Southgate Mechatronics students is currently in Germany for six months on Pels Training, all expenses paid, German language immersion and is working for Durr Industries. All dual enrolled Mechatronics students have job offers, they have received letters of intent to sign, some receiving \$5000 signing bonuses. Those students in the apprenticeship program have college paid for.

This Saturday at Henry Ford College, students will be able to interview with leaders of industry. Mechatronic Students are highly sought after.

The Machine Trades & Engineering program is very similar to Mechatronics and will use the existing supplies and equipment from that program. Expanding upon that with no cost to Southgate, expanding dual enrollment options, but with a certification and credential. Students would come out with certification in machine trades, some CNC machining, which is one of the components of Vulcan Forging in Trenton and all the job shops in the area have this need. Students will also have some electrical and electronics training too. Currently U.S. Steel wants everybody we put out through our program, we just can't meet the needs.

He is asking for board approval of this program, at no expense.

Discussion took place about the type of credits this program would count toward, who would be teaching this program, how many students this class could serve and where the class would be held.

- 3. Approval of 2019 Anderson Toilet Room Remodeling Project: Ms. Pastor presented the information as Mr. Kakoczki was unable to attend tonight's meeting. This request is to approve the bid award for the Anderson toilet room project which will be completed this summer. We are recommending the contract be awarded to allied Building Service Company. Discussion took place about the funding for this project coming from the interest earned from the bond project and the timeline of the bidding for this project. Project is a total gut and will be completed by the fall.
- 2018/19-97 It was moved Dr. Pomponio supported by Mr. Lamos, the board approve the award for the 2019 Anderson high School toilet room remodeling project to Allied Building Service Company in an amount not to exceed \$185,285.00.
