### Fees

### **Core Academic classes**

The basic four-week course fee for residents of LWSD is **\$230** for a middle school course. Non-district residents pay an additional **\$10** for each course taken, **\$240** for a middle school course.

### **Enrichment class**

Algebra 1 Booster Summer School course for students who have been placed in Algebra I for fall 2019. The course runs for 10 days from 7:30-10:40 a.m. The 10-day course fee for residents of LWSD is **\$230** per session. Non-district residents pay an additional **\$10** per session (**\$240**).

Current in-district students can pay by cash or check for paper registration or online by credit card. Online payment option is not available for non-district students - cash or check only. **Do not mail cash**.

### **Reduced Fees**

The Lake Washington School District Board of Directors has determined that **current** LWSD resident students who qualify for free or reduced lunch at their home school during the current school year also qualify for reduced Summer School tuition, for core classes only, subject to the following guidelines:

- 1. Free and reduced forms ARE NOT available during walk-in Summer School registration.
- 2. LWSD must verify students' free or reduced lunch status. Please have the student's current school official verify on the registration form prior to submitting it. Or you may contact Sara Peterson <u>sapeterson@lwsd.org</u> if you cannot reach your current school official, and obtain a Free and Reduced form. After submitting the form to <u>sapeterson@lwsd.org</u>, we will receive verification from Nutrition Services and you will receive an automated call.
- 3. Fee for LWSD residents with free lunch status:
  - Core Summer School \$70 each course 20-day session.
  - Algebra 1 Booster Summer School \$70 10-day; one session

Reduced fees are applicable to all Middle School Summer School classes.

### **Needs Based Scholarship Information**

The scholarship request form is for students who reside and attend school within the Lake Washington School District during the regular school year. Scholarships are for summer school applicants with financial need. Upload the completed form (which can be found on the summer school website at <a href="https://www.lwsd.org/students-families/summer-school">https://www.lwsd.org/students-families/summer-school</a>) with your summer school registration if registering online or mail it in with your paper registration form by June 14 to the Summer School office at Emerson High School, Summer School, 10903 NE 53rd Street, Kirkland, WA 98033, or you can email the completed form to summerschool@lwsd.org prior to making payment.

You will be notified via email if your student is receiving a scholarship. If you have paid the full fee online or sent in your registration paperwork via mail and paid the full fee, and do receive a scholarship, a refund will be issued. Or you can wait and pay in person during walkin or late registration at Redmond High School.

### Fee Refunds

The course fee will be refunded if a course is cancelled. NO refunds will be approved once Summer School classes have begun (after July 8, 2019).

### **Course Cancellations**

Summer School is a self-supporting program dependent on student fees. Courses that fail to achieve minimum student enrollment will be cancelled. Parents will be notified of cancellations, and fees will be refunded as soon as possible, usually in two to four weeks. Your student is considered registered in the class(es) which you choose; **no official confirmation is sent**.

### Transportation

### Shuttle service - Core Academic and Algebra 1 Booster

Parents are responsible for transportation for their students to and from Summer School.

No other district transportation will be provided for Summer School.

### **Attendance Policy - Core Classes**

Punctual attendance each day is essential. Students are expected to be in class on the first and last day of Summer School.

Students who accumulate more than three absences in any class will be withdrawn from Summer School and will not earn credit and tuition will not be reimbursed. An absence is defined as missing more than 30 minutes of any class period. In addition, four tardies

equal one absence. Teachers are not expected to take class time to review any part of a lesson a student may miss. It is the student's responsibility to speak with the teacher to make up or receive any work missed. <u>Refunds will not be granted to students who violate the</u> <u>attendance policy, or who are withdrawn or suspended for disciplinary</u> <u>reasons.</u>

### **Fines**

Laptops and books **must** be returned by the last day of Summer School to the Summer School office at Redmond High School (RHS). Fines are issued for lost, non-returned, or damaged materials. Neither the student's home school nor the parents will receive the student's summer school report card until all fines are paid or reconciled. Students who do not return the laptop and power cord will be fined the full replacement value.

### **Special Services**

Support and accommodations for students with IEPs (Individualized Education Plans) or 504s are provided differently in Summer School. The staff aims to meet the needs of all students; we review current information on your child's IEP or 504 plan to better understand strategies, classroom accommodations, or assignment modifications that allow your child to be successful in a regular classroom environment. Pull-out services for Specially Designed Instruction are not part of the Middle School Summer School program.

### **Medical Information**

Please list on the registration form any important medical information for your child. This might include medical conditions and/or medications that the student may need to take during the school day, for example, for allergies, migraines, etc.

A LWSD Medical Authorization Form **MUST** be completed by a doctor before any medications can be given during the school day. Medical authorization forms are available at your home school and **MUST** be turned in with your registration forms. Medication to be given during school hours by a trained staff member must be brought to the Summer School office on the first day of Summer School.

### **Nutrition Services/Snacks**

Nutrition Services will be offering lunch service during the summer session. The menu will include a variety of items, assorted snacks, and beverages. During the summer session, in-district LWSD students will be able to use their student account for purchases. The full price cost for lunch is \$3.25, available to in- and out-of-district students. The reduced lunch price is \$.40 and is available to current LWSD students only. Menus will be posted in the lunchroom. If you have any questions please contact the Nutrition Office at 425-936-1393.

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### Class Information Core Middle School Courses-Grades 6-8

Core Middle School Summer School courses are for current grade level only based on grade just completed as of June 2019.

Middle school students are **NOT** eligible to enroll in high school courses (grades 9-12) in Summer School, with the following exceptions: current 8th graders who have <u>already taken</u> Algebra 1 or Geometry in 8th grade may **retake** <u>CORE</u> Algebra 1 or Geometry in High School Summer School. Current 8th grade students who are entering ninth grade, who have <u>not previously</u> <u>taken</u> Algebra 1 may take Accelerated Algebra 1 in High School Summer School; and students who are entering ninth grade, who have <u>not previously</u> <u>taken</u> Algebra 1 may take Accelerated Algebra 1 in High School Summer School; and students who are entering ninth grade, who have <u>taken and passed</u> Algebra 1 but have <u>not previously</u> <u>taken</u> Geometry, may take Accelerated Geometry in High School Summer School. See the High School Summer School catalog for registration.

### **English 6, English 7, or English 8** Period 1: 7:30 a.m. – 9:00 a.m. Period 2: 9:10 a.m. – 10:40 a.m.

Students will review previously learned skills and be introduced to new ones. Emphasis will be on the process of writing and the following basic communication skills: grammar, usage, conventions of writing from simple sentences to a five-paragraph essay, vocabulary enrichment, improvement of sentence structure, paragraphing and poetry writing. In addition, students are required to read and evaluate works of literature demonstrating an understanding of literary elements, quality and personal response.

### Reading/Study Skills Period 2: 9:10 a.m. – 10:40 a.m.

This course includes instruction in techniques for improving reading comprehension, and strategies for developing vocabulary, analyzing and evaluating information acquired from various sources. Formal classroom instruction is utilized as well as individualized print materials to aid the student in attaining a higher level of achievement in reading speed, vocabulary, and comprehension.

This course is designed to improve the study skills essential for success in course work. Time management, preparation for studying, textbook reading, listening effectively and critically, note taking, highlighting and test taking are emphasized. Students will appraise their present study skills, improve them and apply these skills in their present and future courses.

### **6th Grade Mathematics**

### Period 1: 7:30 a.m. - 9:00 a.m.

In this course students focus on four critical areas: (1) connecting ratio and rate to whole number multiplication and division and using concepts of ratio and rate to solve problems; (2) completing understanding of division of fractions and extending the notion of number to the system of rational numbers, which includes negative numbers; (3) writing, interpreting, and using expressions and equations; and (4) developing understanding of statistical thinking by describing and summarizing numerical data sets. Students also build on their work with area by reasoning about relationships among shapes to determine area, surface area, and volume.

### 7th Grade Mathematics

### Period 1: 7:30 a.m. - 9:00 a.m.

In this course students build on their understanding from 6th grade by focusing on four critical areas: (1) develop understanding of and applying proportional relationships; (2) developing understanding of operations with rational numbers (explain the rules for adding, subtracting, multiplying, and dividing with negative numbers) and working with expressions and linear equations; (3) solving problems involving scale drawings and informal geometric constructions, and working with two- and three-dimensional shapes to solve problems involving area, surface area, and volume; and (4) drawing inferences about populations based on samples

### 8th Grade Mathematics

### Period 2: 9:10 a.m. - 10:40 a.m.

In this course instructional time focuses on three critical areas: (1) formulating and reasoning about expressions and equations, including modeling an association in bivariate data with a linear equation and solving linear equations and systems of equations; (2) grasping the concept of a function and using functions to describe quantitative relationships; (3) analyzing two- and three-dimensional space and figures using distance, angle, similarity, and congruence, and understanding and applying the Pythagorean Theorem.

### **Enrichment Summer School Classes**

### Algebra 1 Booster – Entering grades 7-8

Session I: July 8 – July 19, 2019 Session II: July 22 – August 2, 2019 7:30 a.m. – 10:40 a.m.

This course is designed for middle school students entering grades 7 or 8 in preparation for Algebra 1. This course does not impact fall 2019 math course placement and is not used to gain entry to Algebra 1 for fall 2019.

This ten-day course is designed for students who will be entering 7th or 8th grade in the fall of 2019 in preparation for Algebra 1. The class will meet for three hours a day and is designed to prepare students for a successful Algebra I class experience. Content includes review of many pre-algebra concepts and a preview of essential foundational Algebra 1 skills.

This course is open to in- and out-of-district students.

### **DigiPen Junior Art and Animation**

Digital production artists are responsible for producing the amazing visual experiences in today's video games and animations. Success in this field requires artistic passion combined with a solid grasp of both traditional and digital art skills. This workshop lets you explore the world of production art through a variety of animation projects using non-digital and digital media.

Students will learn:

- Traditional fine arts skills
- The art and animation production pipeline
- Basic 2D computer animation, modeling, and texturing
- Storytelling, dialogue, and writing techniques for animation

### **DigiPen Junior 2D Game Design**

In Junior 2D Game Design, your student will learn that game design is much more than a pastime — it is a challenging and fulfilling field that rewards passion, creativity, and hard work. In this workshop, your student will apply concepts from math, physics, art, and logic as they create games in a variety of genres. Each student will have the opportunity to create a capstone project by choosing from the different game genres presented during the first week.

Students will learn:

- The game design process
- Game design mechanics
- Basic programming techniques

### **DigiPen Junior Worldbuilding**

What do Bilbo Baggins, Harry Potter, and Percy Jackson have in common? They are live in complete worlds filled with rich detail about their respective geographies, cultures, economies, and bestiaries. Building these worlds is an essential element of game design, art, writing, and filmmaking. In Junior Worldbuilding, your student will create a complete setting that could be the basis of a future novel, film, or game. We will look at real-world and fantasy worlds that your student can use to create a unique setting of their own.

Your student will learn:

- How to design fantasy maps that create a wealth of narrative opportunities
- To create fictional cultures based on real-world examples
- How to build fantastic, but believable, villages, cities, and whole nations
