



Are Your Students Ready for College?

Through collaborative research with postsecondary institutions nationwide, ACT has established the following as college readiness benchmark scores for designated college courses.


A benchmark score is the minimum score needed on an ACT subject-area test to indicate a 50% chance of obtaining a B or higher or about a 75% chance of obtaining a C or higher in the corresponding credit-bearing college courses.

- * English Composition: 18 on ACT English Test
- * College Algebra: 22 on ACT Mathematics Test
- * Social Science: 22 on ACT Reading Test
- * Biology: 23 on ACT Science Test

Students On-Track for Algebra I by 9th Grade







