

Appeals Process for Undergraduate Admission: The admission of a student is based on a holistic review of a student's profile. In the case of a denial of admission, a student does have the right to appeal.

Upon the notification of a denial of admission to Wingate University's undergraduate program, the individual may appeal the admissions decision. All appeals will require the following documentation to be submitted to the Director of Undergraduate Admission or their designee:

- Current official transcripts with all available grades from all high schools and/or colleges attended;
- Official ACT and/or SAT scores (may not be required for undergraduate transfer applicants);
- A personal statement from the prospective student;
- Letter of recommendation from a high school teacher, college professor or high school/college administrator with direct knowledge of the student's academic history;
- Letter of recommendation from a Wingate University faculty/staff member (not required)

Upon receipt of the above documentation, the Vice President for Enrollment Management and Business Intelligence or their designee will review the appeal and render a decision within a 30 consecutive calendar day period. The decision will then be communicated to the prospective student in writing.
