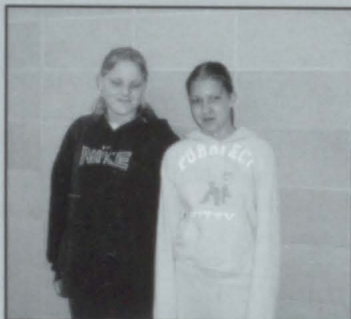

TROMBONE(tram'bon')

A large brass instrument, usually with a slide, or movable section. Also called a *slide trombone*.

CLARINET(klar'e net')

A single-reed woodwind instrument played by means of holes and keys. Invented by John Clarinet in the late Middle Ages. He was later sentenced to death and killed by one.

A large drum, sometimes referred to as a kettledrum, usually played by one performer. From tympanum, which is also a term for a membrane in the ear.

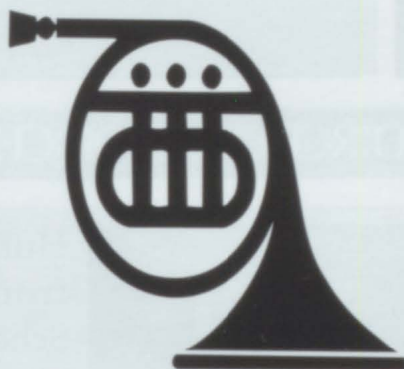

A mellow-toned brass instrument with a long spiral tube and a flaring bell: now usually *horn*. The inventor was later sentenced to death and killed by one.

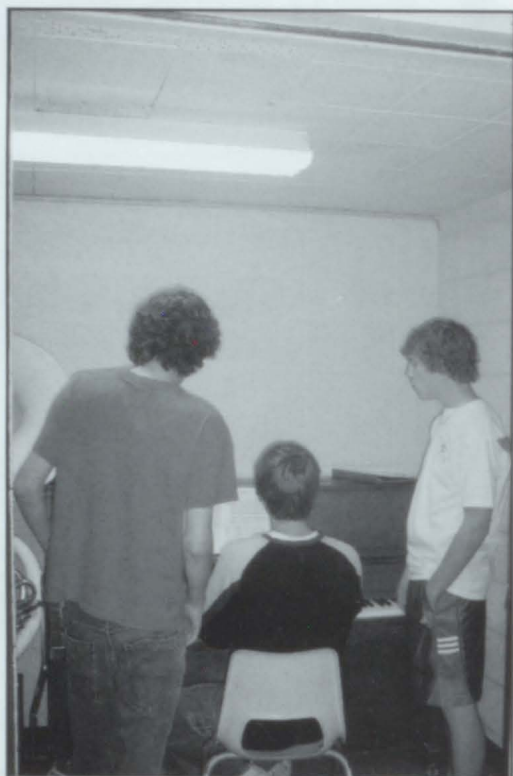

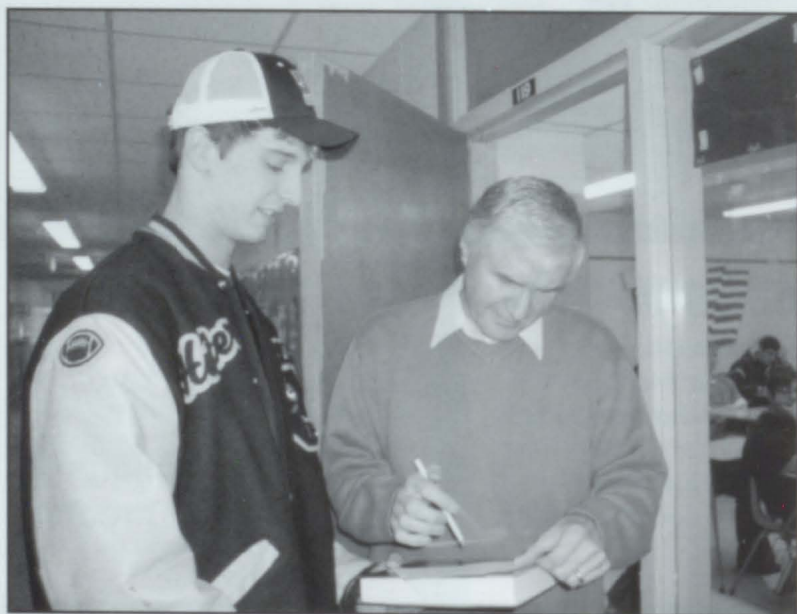

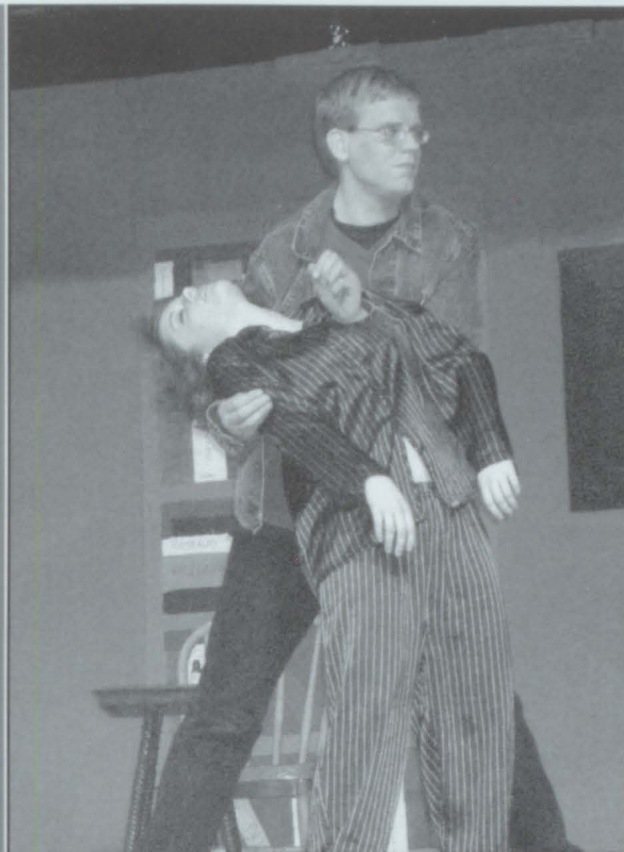

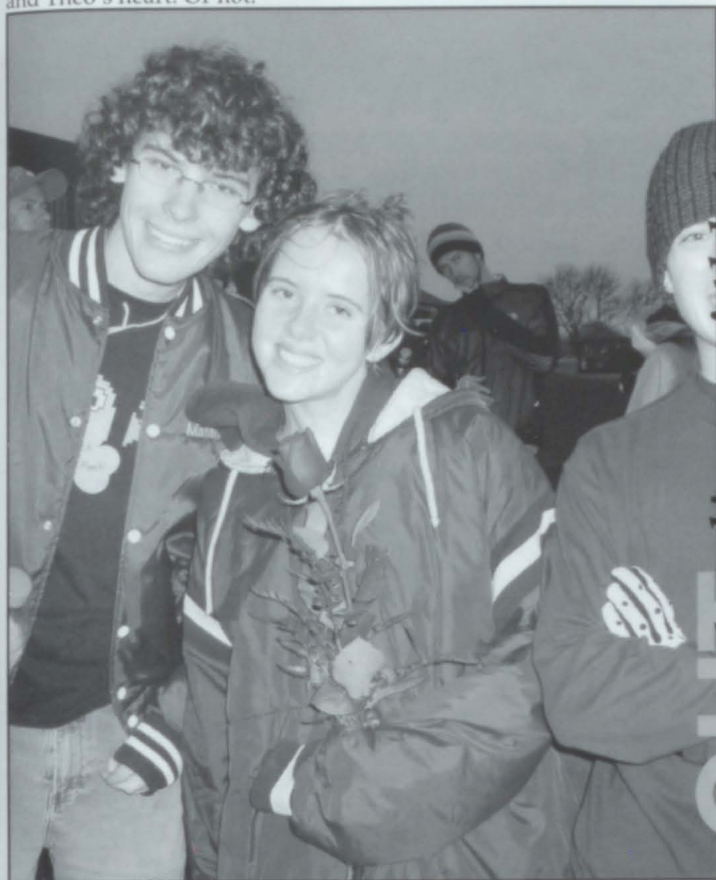

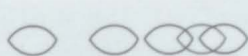

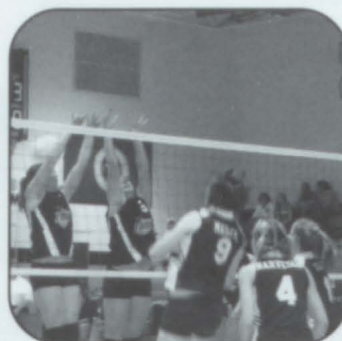

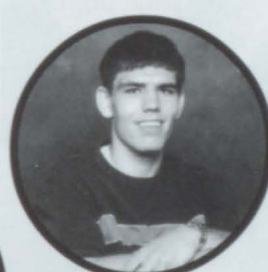

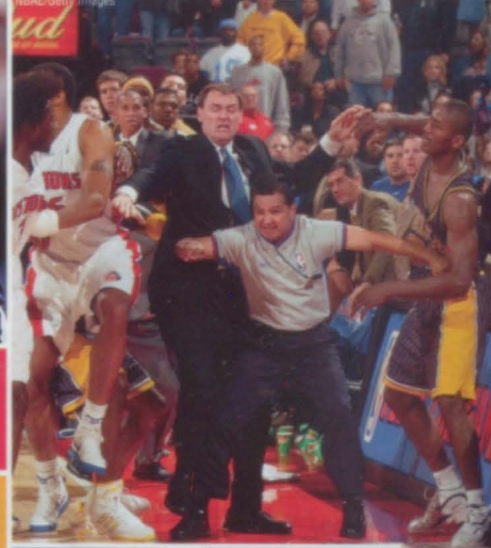
