Climate and Culture Survey Report Dr. Michelle Hubbard, associate superintendent of leadership and learning, and Dr. Dan Gruman, coordinator of assessment and research, provided a report on the results of the climate and culture survey conducted in January. Corwin Equity Professional Development John McKinney, director of student and family services, and Linda Sieck, President of NEA Shawnee Mission shared a presentation on Corwin Equity Professional Development. The professional development will allow for every staff member in the district to receive training on equity starting in the 2019-2020 school year. The training aligns with beliefs identified in the district's strategic plan and is designed to apply directly back to student learning. The Board of Education later approved the Corwin professional development contract as presented.

Fee Schedule The Shawnee Mission Board of Education approved the fee schedule for the 2019-20 school year. The schedule reflects a change in lunch fees, due to increases in expenses. To view the fee schedule, <u>click here</u>.

Food Services Management The Board of Education approved revisions to Board Policy EE: Food Service Management. The new policy states: "All negative account balances will follow the student each year. If the debt is not repaid it shall be considered bad debt for the purposes of federal law

concerning unpaid meal charges. (See Policy JS for debt collection). At the conclusion of each semester, negative student accounts will be turned over to the collection agency in accordance with district procedures. Any student who leaves the district including graduating seniors with an account balance owed will be turned over to collections." To read the full policy, <u>click here</u>.
