Colleges courses in 9th - 12th grade






Upon graduation, early college high school students can earn their high school diploma and their associates degree (up to 60 college credit hours) free of charge.

Transportation, tuition, textbooks and TCC testing fees waived

Where are we located?






9TH and 10th Grade Campus Timberview High School

How have we designed our school?

- 50 College-Going Culture

ECHS is an Accelerated Track to College


What is the history of ECHS?

The ECHS model was introduced in 2006, and the number of ECHS programs in Texas increases yearly.

The reason is simple:

- + serious commitment
- + minimal distractions
- + small community
- + rigorous learning environment
- = high school graduates with brighter futures and prepared for a 4 year university/college

Do TCC credits transfer to any college?


TCC college credit is transferrable to state four year college & universities in Texas and some out of state institutions.

Many Ivy League and selective universities may not accept Advanced Placement, dual enrollment and CLEP, but those universities want to know if a student was highly successful in the most rigorous courses offered at the high school. ie. AP or dual enrollment. These courses are a gateway to being admitted into selective colleges. Also these colleges may offer placement exams in the summer before a student's freshmen year.

GOOD CANDIDATES FOR ECHS ARE STUDENTS WHO MEET ONE OR MORE AREAS:

- **WORK HARD AND HAVE A GOOD ATTITUDE**
- ⁵⁰ May need extra support to accelerate learning
- ⁵⁰ Have a good discipline and attendance record
- so Are mature enough to work well with others
- May be experiencing challenges that prevent them from making a smooth transition into college
- ⁵⁰ Immense focus to pursue college and career earlier
- Desires to attend and are not being forced to attend
- Are willing to give up participation in school sponsored athletics or fine arts (ECHS has no athletic teams or fine arts programs we do have student clubs and organizations)

High School & College Standards

Our high school standards	College standards
Attendance – 90% rule	Instructor Discretion – drop student at any time
Behavior – HS teachers can manage students. Schools can suspend.	Behavior – College instructors do not have to manage. They will remove students from class.
Will teach note taking for success - AVID	Must know how to take notes
Grading: A – F percentage	Grading: up to professor ie. percentage, points
Teachers teach and break down information	College instructors give information. Students must teach information to self.
Tutorial Hours	Conference Time
Parent can reach out to teacher	Student must reach out to professor
Teacher <u>encourages</u> learning and accountability and will teach what that looks like.	Professors expect learning and accountability, but will not teach what that looks like.
HS provide structure, discipline and reminders	College provides freedom and independence because it is assumed that students can discipline self.

Can a student be removed from ECHS?

Students accepted into the program must adhere to the attendance, grade and discipline policies set in place by MISD and TCC. The ECHS <u>encourages a safe and collaborative community of learners.</u>

The following may result in removal from ECHS:

- ∞ Excessive absences
- not see the second seco
- 50 Disruptive behavior

Student Withdrawal

Families who do not want to be apart of the school can also withdrawal from school with an <u>exit conference</u> by the end of the semester or before the 90% attendance rule takes an effect.

What's the difference between ECHS and other schools?

- No participation in UIL Athletics

- Pre-AP, AP, College courses with accelerated track.
 No modified curriculum
- Earn up to 60 hours, earn an associate's degree with free tuition, books and testing fees.
- smaller school
- p> Everyone take AVID
- Associate's degree pathway dictates our courses


What is the Value of an ECHS Education?



Application Process

There are two rounds of the application process

- Round 1: Review <u>Completed</u> Applications **Must be complete* Round 2: Parent & Student Interviews @ ECHS
- Applicants move to digital lottery system to select 100 candidates.


What am I agreeing to as an ECHS family?

- I believe I am able to complete the Associate's Degree plan offered at the Early College High School and have researched the transferability of the Texas Core Curriculum to the college and/or university of my choice.
- ¹ I understand that we offer Pre-AP and TCC courses. We do not offer a SpED modified curriculum.
- I understand that ECHS is a small learning community looking for mature students who will lead and contribute to building the collegiate culture of the school.
- I will maintain high academic and behavior standards and understand that failing courses or exhibiting behavior that jeopardizes the learning environment could result in removal from the ECHS.
- ¹ I understand that I am enrolling into an AVID school-wide site and will abide by the expectations of the AVID program.
- ¹ I agree to maintain academic integrity by not cheating, plagiarizing, or using anyone else's work as my own.
- ⁵⁰ I understand I must turn in all assignments on time and monitor grades and attendance.
